## Associations of "Big deal" (30 Words)

<b>ample</b>	Large and accommodating. <i>There is <b>ample</b> time for discussion.</i>
<b>armful</b>	As much as a person can hold in both arms. <i>Most of us will end up with <b>armfuls</b> of stuff we do not need.</i>
<b>bulky</b>	(of a person) heavily built. <i>A <b>bulky</b> overcoat clad figure.</i>
<b>colossal</b>	(of a statue) at least twice life size. <i>A <b>colossal</b> mistake.</i>
<b>cumbersome</b>	Large or heavy and therefore difficult to carry or use; unwieldy. <i>A <b>cumbersome</b> piece of machinery.</i>
<b>elephantine</b>	Of great mass; huge and bulky. <i>There was an <b>elephantine</b> thud from the bathroom.</i>
<b>enormous</b>	Very large in size, quantity, or extent. <i><b>Enormous</b> sums of money.</i>
<b>gargantuan</b>	Of great mass; huge and bulky. <i>A <b>gargantuan</b> appetite.</i>
<b>giant</b>	Used in names of very large animals and plants e g giant hogweed giant tortoise. <i><b>Giant</b> multinational corporations.</i>
<b><a href="#">gigantic</a></b>	So exceedingly large or extensive as to suggest a giant or mammoth. <i><b>Gigantic</b> disappointment.</i>
<b><a href="#">hefty</a></b>	(of a person) possessing physical strength and weight; rugged and powerful. <i>A <b>hefty</b> 10 million.</i>
<b>huge</b>	Unusually great in size or amount or degree or especially extent or scope. <i>A <b>huge</b> wave.</i>
<b>hulking</b>	(of a person or object) very large, heavy, or clumsy. <i>A <b>hulking</b> figure of a man.</i>

<b>immense</b>	Unusually great in size or amount or degree or especially extent or scope. <i>The cost of restoration has been <b>immense</b>.</i>
<b>large</b>	Fairly large or important in effect influential. <i>A <b>large</b> effect.</i>
<b>largeness</b>	The quality of being pretentious (behaving or speaking in such a manner as to create a false appearance of great importance or worth). <i>A man distinguished by the <b>largeness</b> and scope of his views.</i>
<b>mammoth</b>	So exceedingly large or extensive as to suggest a giant or mammoth. <i>A <b>mammoth</b> ship.</i>
<b>massive</b>	Consisting of great mass; containing a great quantity of matter. <i>A <b>massive</b> rampart of stone.</i>
<b>ogre</b>	A cruel wicked and inhuman person. <i>It is clear that I am no <b>ogre</b>.</i>
<b>oversize</b>	Larger than normal for its kind.
<b>oversized</b>	Larger than normal for its kind. <i>An <b>oversized</b> T shirt.</i>
<b>sized</b>	Having a specified size. <i>Comfortably <b>sized</b> rooms.</i>
<b>stupendous</b>	So great in size or force or extent as to elicit awe. <i>The most <b>stupendous</b> views.</i>
<b>titanic</b>	Of exceptional strength, size, or power. <i>A series of <b>titanic</b> explosions.</i>
<b>titter</b>	A nervous restrained laugh. <i>There were <b>titters</b> from the gallery.</i>
<b>tome</b>	A (usually) large and scholarly book. <i>A weighty <b>tome</b>.</i>
<b>tremendous</b>	Extreme in degree or extent or amount or impact. <i>There was a <b>tremendous</b> explosion.</i>
<b>unwieldy</b>	Difficult to work or manipulate. <i><b>Unwieldy</b> rules and regulations.</i>
<b>vast</b>	Of very great extent or quantity; immense. <i>The <b>vast</b> reaches of outer space.</i>
<b>voluminous</b>	Marked by repeated turns and bends. <i>He sank into a <b>voluminous</b> armchair.</i>
