ample	Large and accommodating. <i>There is ample time for discussion.</i>
armful	As much as a person can hold in both arms. <i>Most of us will end up with armfuls of stuff we do not need.</i>
bulky	(of a person) heavily built. <i>A bulky overcoat clad figure.</i>
colossal	(of a statue) at least twice life size. <i>A colossal mistake.</i>
cumbersome	Large or heavy and therefore difficult to carry or use; unwieldy. <i>A cumbersome piece of machinery.</i>
elephantine	Of great mass; huge and bulky. <i>There was an elephantine thud from the bathroom.</i>
enormous	Very large in size, quantity, or extent. <i>Enormous sums of money.</i>
gargantuan	Of great mass; huge and bulky. <i>A gargantuan appetite.</i>
giant	Used in names of very large animals and plants e g giant hogweed giant tortoise. <i>Giant multinational corporations.</i>
gigantic	So exceedingly large or extensive as to suggest a giant or mammoth. <i>Gigantic disappointment.</i>
hefty	(of a person) possessing physical strength and weight; rugged and powerful. <i>A hefty 10 million.</i>
huge	Unusually great in size or amount or degree or especially extent or scope. <i>A huge wave.</i>
hulking	(of a person or object) very large, heavy, or clumsy. <i>A hulking figure of a man.</i>

immense	Unusually great in size or amount or degree or especially extent or scope. <i>The cost of restoration has been immense.</i>
large	Fairly large or important in effect influential. <i>A large effect.</i>
largeness	The quality of being pretentious (behaving or speaking in such a manner as to create a false appearance of great importance or worth). <i>A man distinguished by the largeness and scope of his views.</i>
mammoth	So exceedingly large or extensive as to suggest a giant or mammoth. <i>A mammoth ship.</i>
massive	Consisting of great mass; containing a great quantity of matter. <i>A massive rampart of stone.</i>
ogre	A cruel wicked and inhuman person. <i>It is clear that I am no ogre.</i>
oversize	Larger than normal for its kind.
oversized	Larger than normal for its kind. <i>An oversized T shirt.</i>
sized	Having a specified size. <i>Comfortably sized rooms.</i>
stupendous	So great in size or force or extent as to elicit awe. <i>The most stupendous views.</i>
titanic	Of exceptional strength, size, or power. <i>A series of titanic explosions.</i>
titter	A nervous restrained laugh. <i>There were titters from the gallery.</i>
tome	A (usually) large and scholarly book. <i>A weighty tome.</i>
tremendous	Extreme in degree or extent or amount or impact. <i>There was a tremendous explosion.</i>
unwieldy	Difficult to work or manipulate. <i>Unwieldy rules and regulations.</i>
vast	Of very great extent or quantity; immense. <i>The vast reaches of outer space.</i>
voluminous	Marked by repeated turns and bends. <i>He sank into a voluminous armchair.</i>
