- A prejudiced person who is intolerant of any opinions differing from his own.
- A person who is obstinately or unreasonably attached to a belief, opinion, or faction, especially one who is prejudiced against or antagonistic towards a person or people on the basis of their membership of a particular group.

Synonyms of "Bigot" as a noun (3 Words)

dogmatist A stubborn person of arbitrary or arrogant opinions.

A pike with a long tapering double-edged blade with lateral projections; 16th and 17th centuries.

Partisans of the exiled Stuarts.

A person who rigidly follows the doctrines of a sect or other group.

sectarian He became a target as a **sectarian** who had apparently denounced one liberal minded reformer as degenerate.
