Definitions of "Bigot" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “bigot” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A prejudiced person who is intolerant of any opinions differing from his own.*
- *A person who is obstinately or unreasonably attached to a belief, opinion, or faction, especially one who is prejudiced against or antagonistic towards a person or people on the basis of their membership of a particular group.*

Synonyms of "Bigot" as a noun (3 Words)

dogmatist A stubborn person of arbitrary or arrogant opinions.

partisan A pike with a long tapering double-edged blade with lateral projections; 16th and 17th centuries.

Partisans of the exiled Stuarts.

A person who rigidly follows the doctrines of a sect or other group.

sectarian *He became a target as a **sectarian** who had apparently denounced one liberal minded reformer as degenerate.*

Usage Examples of "Bigot" as a noun

- *A racist bigot.*

- *Don't let a few small-minded bigots destroy the good image of the city.*

Associations of "Bigot" (30 Words)

ageism	Discrimination on the basis of a person's age. <i>Ageism in recruitment is an increasing problem.</i>
apartheid	A social policy or racial segregation involving political and economic and legal discrimination against people who are not Whites; the former official policy in South Africa. <i>Gender apartheid.</i>
bias	Give a bias to. <i>The bias towards younger people in recruitment.</i>
biased	Favoring one person or side over another. <i>A biased account of the trial.</i>
bigoted	Blindly and obstinately attached to some creed or opinion and intolerant toward others. <i>A thoughtless and bigoted article.</i>
bigotry	Obstinate or unreasonable attachment to a belief, opinion, or faction; in particular, prejudice against a person or people on the basis of their membership of a particular group. <i>The difficulties of combating prejudice and bigotry.</i>
discriminate	Perceive or constitute the difference in or between. <i>I could not discriminate the different tastes in this complicated dish.</i>
discrimination	The selection of a signal having a required characteristic, such as frequency or amplitude, by means of a discriminator. <i>Discrimination learning.</i>
discriminatory	Manifesting partiality. <i>Discriminatory attitudes and practices.</i>
equality	The quality of being the same in quantity or measure or value or status. <i>An organization aiming to promote racial equality.</i>
ethnocentrism	Evaluation of other cultures according to preconceptions originating in the standards and customs of one's own culture.
fanaticism	Excessive intolerance of opposing views. <i>The dangers of religious fanaticism.</i>
feminist	A supporter of feminism. <i>Feminist literature.</i>
illiberal	Narrow-minded about cherished opinions. <i>Illiberal and anti democratic policies.</i>

<u>impatient</u>	(usually followed by `to') full of eagerness. <i>An impatient motorist blaring his horn.</i>
<u>injustice</u>	The practice of being unjust or unfair. <i>Brooding over life s injustices.</i>
<u>intolerance</u>	An inability to eat a food or take a drug without adverse effects. <i>He may have a food intolerance to dairy products.</i>
<u>intolerant</u>	Not tolerant of views, beliefs, or behaviour that differ from one's own. <i>He s recently been diagnosed as gluten intolerant.</i>
invidious	(of a comparison or distinction) unfairly discriminating; unjust. <i>Invidious comparisons.</i>
jaundiced	Affected by bitterness, resentment, or cynicism. <i>Takes a jaundiced view of societies and clubs.</i>
misogynist	Relating to or characteristic of a misogynist. <i>A bachelor and renowned misogynist.</i>
<u>partial</u>	A harmonic with a frequency that is a multiple of the fundamental frequency. <i>Partial collapse.</i>
prejudice	Give rise to prejudice in someone make biased. <i>Prejudice against people from different backgrounds.</i>
prejudiced	Emanating from a person's emotions and prejudices. <i>People are prejudiced against us.</i>
racism	The belief that different races possess distinct characteristics, abilities, or qualities, especially so as to distinguish them as inferior or superior to one another. <i>A programme to combat racism.</i>
racist	A person who is prejudiced against or antagonistic towards people on the basis of their membership of a particular racial or ethnic group, typically one that is a minority or marginalized. <i>The systems work to uphold and enforce racist policies.</i>
sexism	Discriminatory or abusive behavior towards members of the opposite sex. <i>Sexism in language is an offensive reminder of the way the culture sees women.</i>
<u>sexist</u>	A person with sexist views. <i>I want to make it clear that I m certainly not a sexist.</i>
<u>subjective</u>	The subjective case. <i>There is always the danger of making a subjective judgement.</i>
xenophobia	Dislike of or prejudice against people from other countries. <i>The resurgence of racism and xenophobia.</i>
