bilingualist A person who speaks two languages fluently.

- construe** Analyse the syntax of (a text, sentence, or word).
*His words could hardly be **construed** as an apology.*
- dictionary** A reference book on a particular subject, the items of which are typically arranged in alphabetical order.
*A **dictionary** of quotations.*
- english** Of or relating to or characteristic of England or its culture or people.

fluency	The ability to express oneself easily and articulately. <i>Fluency in Spanish is essential.</i>
fluently	In a way that progresses smoothly. <i>Smith batted fluently to hit 11 fours off 115 balls.</i>
grammarian	A person who studies and writes about grammar.
<u>interpret</u>	Give an interpretation or rendition of. <i>He would no longer interpret her silence as indifference.</i>
interpreter	A program that translates and executes source language statements one line at a time. <i>She was famous as an interpreter of Shakespearean roles.</i>
interpretive	That provides interpretation.
language	Language communication by word of mouth. <i>He recorded the spoken language of the streets.</i>
lexicographer	A person who compiles dictionaries.
lexicon	The complete set of meaningful units in a language. <i>A Greek Latin lexicon.</i>
linguist	A person who studies linguistics.
<u>linguistic</u>	Relating to language or linguistics. <i>A linguistic atlas.</i>
literate	A literate person. <i>Computer literate.</i>
multilingual	Using or knowing more than one language. <i>A multilingual nation.</i>
<u>paraphrase</u>	Express the meaning of (something written or spoken) using different words, especially to achieve greater clarity. <i>Scattered here and there in the text are frank paraphrases of lines from Virgil Cicero and Quintilian.</i>
philologist	A humanist specializing in classical scholarship.
polyglot	(of a book) having the text translated into several languages. <i>New Orleans has always been a polyglot city.</i>
proficient	A person who is proficient. <i>She felt reasonably proficient in Italian.</i>
sentence	Pronounce a sentence on somebody in a court of law. <i>Her husband is serving a three year sentence for fraud.</i>
<u>spoken</u>	Speaking in a specified way. <i>A spoken message.</i>

spokesperson	A spokesman or spokeswoman (used as a neutral alternative). A spokesperson for the Scottish Office.
translate	Convert (a sequence of nucleotides in messenger RNA) to an amino acid sequence in a protein or polypeptide during synthesis. <i>The growth in income translates into greater purchasing power.</i>
translation	The process whereby genetic information coded in messenger RNA directs the formation of a specific protein at a ribosome in the cytoplasm. <i>A Spanish translation of Calvin's great work.</i>
translator	A person who translates written messages from one language to another. <i>The translator of Hardy's poems into Icelandic.</i>
vocabulary	A language user's knowledge of words. <i>The Sanskrit vocabulary.</i>
vowel	A letter of the alphabet standing for a spoken vowel.
word	Put into words or an expression. <i>Her father would have had words with her about that.</i>
