- construe** Analyse the syntax of (a text, sentence, or word).  
*His words could hardly be **construed** as an apology.*
- dictionary** A reference book on a particular subject, the items of which are typically arranged in alphabetical order.  
*A **dictionary** of quotations.*
- english** Of or relating to or characteristic of England or its culture or people.

<b>fluency</b>	The ability to express oneself easily and articulately. <i><b>Fluency</b> in Spanish is essential.</i>
<b>fluently</b>	In a way that progresses smoothly. <i>Smith batted <b>fluently</b> to hit 11 fours off 115 balls.</i>
<b>grammarian</b>	A person who studies and writes about grammar.
<b><u>interpret</u></b>	Give an interpretation or rendition of. <i>He would no longer <b>interpret</b> her silence as indifference.</i>
<b>interpreter</b>	A program that translates and executes source language statements one line at a time. <i>She was famous as an <b>interpreter</b> of Shakespearean roles.</i>
<b>interpretive</b>	That provides interpretation.
<b>language</b>	Language communication by word of mouth. <i>He recorded the spoken <b>language</b> of the streets.</i>
<b>lexicographer</b>	A person who compiles dictionaries.
<b>lexicon</b>	The complete set of meaningful units in a language. <i>A Greek Latin <b>lexicon</b>.</i>
<b>linguist</b>	A person who studies linguistics.
<b><u>linguistic</u></b>	Relating to language or linguistics. <i>A <b>linguistic</b> atlas.</i>
<b>literate</b>	A literate person. <i>Computer <b>literate</b>.</i>
<b>multilingual</b>	Using or knowing more than one language. <i>A <b>multilingual</b> nation.</i>
<b><u>paraphrase</u></b>	Express the meaning of (something written or spoken) using different words, especially to achieve greater clarity. <i>Scattered here and there in the text are frank <b>paraphrases</b> of lines from Virgil Cicero and Quintilian.</i>
<b>philologist</b>	A humanist specializing in classical scholarship.
<b>polyglot</b>	(of a book) having the text translated into several languages. <i>New Orleans has always been a <b>polyglot</b> city.</i>
<b>proficient</b>	A person who is proficient. <i>She felt reasonably <b>proficient</b> in Italian.</i>
<b>sentence</b>	Pronounce a sentence on somebody in a court of law. <i>Her husband is serving a three year <b>sentence</b> for fraud.</i>
<b><u>spoken</u></b>	Speaking in a specified way. <i>A <b>spoken</b> message.</i>

<b>spokesperson</b>	A spokesman or spokeswoman (used as a neutral alternative). A <b>spokesperson</b> for the Scottish Office.
<b>translate</b>	Convert (a sequence of nucleotides in messenger RNA) to an amino acid sequence in a protein or polypeptide during synthesis. <i>The growth in income <b>translates</b> into greater purchasing power.</i>
<b>translation</b>	The process whereby genetic information coded in messenger RNA directs the formation of a specific protein at a ribosome in the cytoplasm. <i>A Spanish <b>translation</b> of Calvin's great work.</i>
<b>translator</b>	A person who translates written messages from one language to another. <i>The <b>translator</b> of Hardy's poems into Icelandic.</i>
<b>vocabulary</b>	A language user's knowledge of words. <i>The Sanskrit <b>vocabulary</b>.</i>
<b>vowel</b>	A letter of the alphabet standing for a spoken vowel.
<b>word</b>	Put into words or an expression. <i>Her father would have had <b>words</b> with her about that.</i>
