Definitions of "Billet" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “billet” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A place to stop or stay.*
- *A place, especially a civilian's house, where soldiers are lodged temporarily.*
- *Lodging for military personnel (especially in a private home).*
- *A short personal letter.*
- *A job in an organization.*



Synonyms of "Billet" as a noun (13 Words)

- berth** A place where a craft can be made fast.
*I ll sleep in the upper **berth**.*
- line** Denoting an image consisting of lines and solid areas with no gradation of tone.
*The company intends to hire more people and expand its product **line**.*
- living quarters** The condition of living or the state of being alive.
- note** A banknote.
*There was a **note** of gaiety in her manner.*
- office** Of a government or government official holding an office means being in power.
*The whole **office** was late the morning of the blizzard.*
- place** A vacancy or available position.
*He would always have a special **place** in her heart.*

position	A proposition laid down or asserted a tenet or assertion. <i>Moved from third to fifth position.</i>
post	A starting post or winning post. <i>There is an officer s club on the post.</i>
quarters	The rear part of a ship. <i>He found quarters for his family.</i>
rooms	Apartment consisting of a series of connected rooms used as a living unit as in a hotel.
short letter	The location on a baseball field where the shortstop is stationed.
situation	A set of circumstances in which one finds oneself; a state of affairs. <i>Found herself in a very fortunate situation.</i>
spot	A pimple. <i>Her father was at the spot with his friends.</i>



Usage Examples of "Billet" as a noun

- *The young people's stay at each of their billets was short.*
- *The sergeant gave them leave to rest while officers went in search of billets.*



Billet as a Verb

Definitions of "Billet" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "billet" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Lodge (soldiers) in a particular place, especially a civilian's house.*
- *Provide housing for (military personnel).*
- *Assign temporary accommodation to.*



Synonyms of "Billet" as a verb (6 Words)

Be agreeable or acceptable to.

accommodate *The scientists had to **accommodate** the new results with the existing theories.*

canton	Divide into cantons of a country.
house	Provide housing for. <i>It could be that I just housed a massive burrito but I don t feel good.</i>
lodge	Be a lodger stay temporarily. <i>The money is lodged in a bank.</i>
put up	Estimate.
quarter	Divide into quarters. <i>You would have had her quartered on you forever.</i>



Usage Examples of "Billet" as a verb

- *The American team was billeted at Uxbridge.*
- *Most of the army was billeted within the town.*
