Her father was at the **spot** with his friends.






Usage Examples of "Billet" as a noun

Definitions of "Billet" as a verb

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "billet" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Lodge (soldiers) in a particular place, especially a civilian's house.
- Provide housing for (military personnel.
- Assign temporary accommodation to.



Synonyms of "Billet" as a verb (6 Words)

Be agreeable or acceptable to.

accommodate The scientists had to **accommodate** the new results with the existing theories.



canton Divide into cantons of a country.

house Provide housing for.

It could be that I just **house**d a massive burrito but I don t feel good.

lodge Be a lodger stay temporarily.

The money is **lodge**d in a bank.

put up Estimate.

quarter Divide into quarters.

You would have had her **quarter**ed on you forever.
