- *A pre-compiled, pre-linked program that is ready to run under a given operating system; a binary for one operating system will not run on a different operating system.*



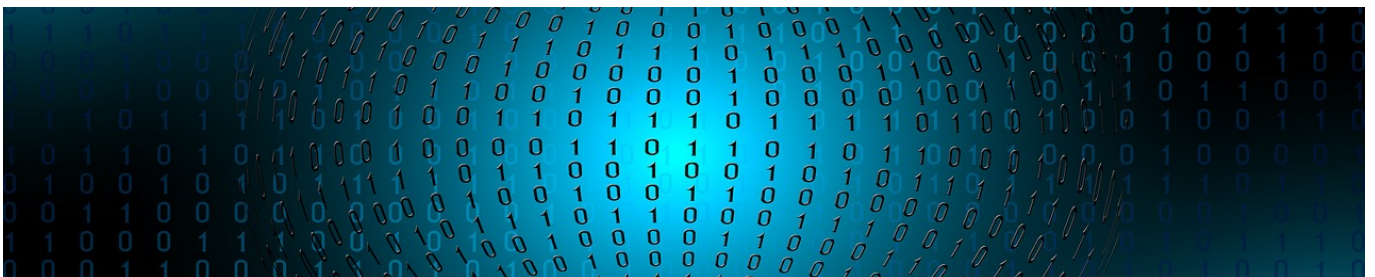
### Synonyms of "Binary" as a noun (3 Words)

## Binary as an Adjective

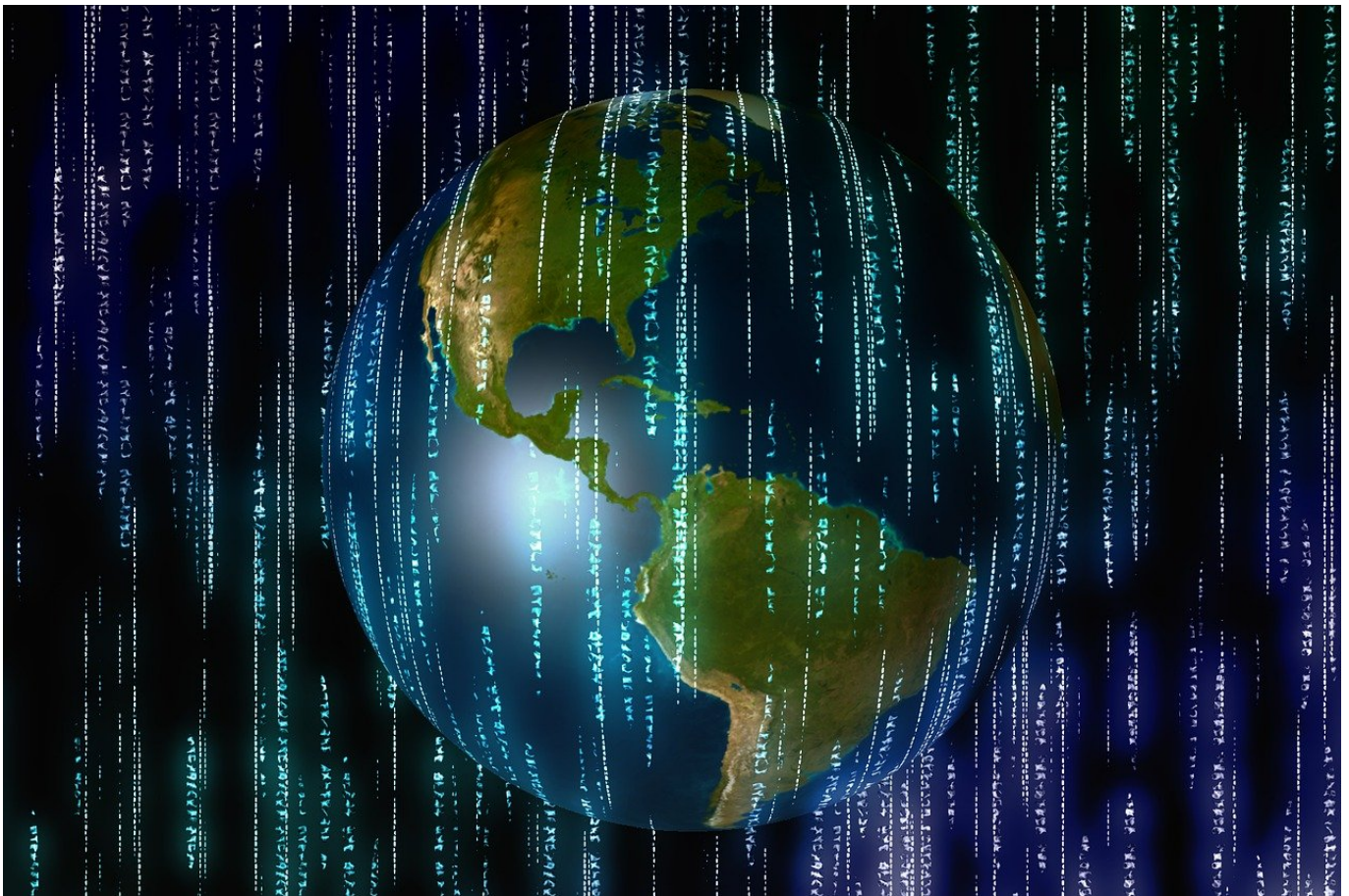
### Definitions of "Binary" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "binary" as an adjective can have the



following definitions:

- *Consisting of two (units or components or elements or terms).*
- *Relating to, using, or denoting a system of numerical notation that has 2 rather than 10 as a base.*
- *Relating to, composed of, or involving two things.*
- *Of or pertaining to a number system have 2 as its base.*



## Synonyms of "Binary" as an adjective (11 Words)

**complementary** Relating to complementary medicine.  
*Complementary therapies such as aromatherapy.*

**coupled** (of two electrical components) connected through electromagnetic induction, electrostatic charge, or an optical link.  
*Networks of **coupled** oscillators.*

<b>duplex</b>	Having two parts used technically of a device or process duplex adj allowing communication in opposite directions simultaneously. <i>A <b>duplex</b> transaction.</i>
<b><u>duplicate</u></b>	Exactly like something else, especially through having been copied. <i>A <b>duplicate</b> key.</i>
<b>in pairs</b>	Directed or bound inward.
<b>matched</b>	Put together as being equal, similar, or complementary to each other. <i>Evenly <b>matched</b> teams.</i>
<b>matching</b>	Being two identical. <i>The college will provide <b>matching</b> funds to complete the project.</i>
<b><u>paired</u></b>	Of leaves etc; growing in pairs on either side of a stem. <i>A characteristic arrangement of <b>paired</b> fins.</i>
<b><u>twin</u></b>	Of a crystal twinned. <i>The <b>twin</b> problems of economic failure and social disintegration.</i>
<b>twofold</b>	Having two parts or elements. <i>A <b>twofold</b> increase.</i>

## Associations of "Binary" (30 Words)

<b>aorta</b>	The large trunk artery that carries blood from the left ventricle of the heart to branch arteries.
<b>arithmetic</b>	Relating to arithmetic. <i>Arithmetic had never been her strong point.</i>
<b>bifocal</b>	A pair of glasses with bifocal lenses. <i>Bifocal eyeglasses.</i>
<b>bifurcate</b>	Divide into two branches. <i>A bifurcate tree.</i>
<b>cloven</b>	Split, divided.
<b>coalescence</b>	The union of diverse things into one body or form or group; the growing together of parts. <i>The lack of coalescence among fields of science.</i>
<b>code</b>	Convert the words of a message into a code so as to convey a secret meaning. <i>One pair of homologous chromosomes codes for eye colour.</i>
<b>cryptography</b>	The science of analyzing and deciphering codes and ciphers and cryptograms.
<b>decimal</b>	A fraction whose denominator is a power of ten and whose numerator is expressed by figures placed to the right of a decimal point. <i>The decimal system.</i>
<b>denominator</b>	The divisor of a fraction.
<b>dichotomous</b>	Exhibiting or characterized by dichotomy. <i>A dichotomous view of the world.</i>
<b>dichotomy</b>	Being twofold; a classification into two opposed parts or subclasses. <i>The dichotomy between eastern and western culture.</i>
<b>digit</b>	One of the elements that collectively form a system of numeration. <i>0 and 1 are digits.</i>
<b>divergent</b>	Diverging from another or from a standard. <i>Divergent thinking.</i>
<b>divided</b>	Distributed in portions (often equal) on the basis of a plan or purpose. <i>The deputy came back carrying a divided metal plate and a cup.</i>
<b>divisible</b>	Capable of being divided. <i>The Americans fought a bloody war to prove that their nation is not divisible.</i>

<b>division</b>	A group of organisms forming a subdivision of a larger category. <i>The plant can also be easily increased by <b>division</b> in autumn.</i>
<b>dual</b>	A dual form of a word. <i><b>Dual</b> controls for pilot and copilot.</i>
<b>encode</b>	(of a gene) be responsible for producing (a substance or behaviour). <i><b>Encode</b> pictures digitally.</i>
<b>factorize</b>	(with reference to a number) resolve or be resolvable into factors. <i>All matrices can be <b>factorized</b>.</i>
<b>geometer</b>	A mathematician specializing in geometry.
<b>math</b>	Mathematics. <i>She teaches <b>math</b> and science.</i>
<b>mathematics</b>	The abstract science of number quantity and space either as abstract concepts pure mathematics or as applied to other disciplines such as physics and engineering applied mathematics. <i>James immerses himself in the <b>mathematics</b> of baseball.</i>
<b>number</b>	Add up in number or quantity. <i>I hope to become one of their <b>number</b> before I die.</i>
<b>partition</b>	Divide a room into smaller rooms or areas by erecting partitions. <i><b>Partition</b> a room off.</i>
<b>sect</b>	A subdivision of a larger religious group. <i>A <b>sect</b> of anarchists.</i>
<b>separated</b>	Separated at the joint. <i>A <b>separated</b> shoulder.</i>
<b>split</b>	A split osier used in basketwork. <i>I told him I wouldn't <b>split</b> on him.</i>
<b>subtrahend</b>	A quantity or number to be subtracted from another.
<b>times</b>	A more or less definite period of time now or previously present. <i>It was a sign of the <b>times</b>.</i>
