Associations of "Biologically" (30 Words)

affective	Characterized by emotion. <i>Affective disorders.</i>
behavioral	Of or relating to behavior. <i>Behavioral sciences.</i>
biology	The study of living organisms, divided into many specialized fields that cover their morphology, physiology, anatomy, behaviour, origin, and distribution. <i>The biology of the Chesapeake Bay.</i>
biosphere	The regions of the surface and atmosphere of the Earth (or other planet) where living organisms exist. <i>The elliptical domed biosphere is the largest single span glasshouse in the world.</i>
character	A characteristic especially one that assists in the identification of a species. <i>Shady characters.</i>
clone	Propagate an organism or cell as a clone. <i>We have cloned DNA sequences added to the ends of the linear plasmid.</i>
genetically	In a way that relates to origin or development. <i>A genetically inherited condition.</i>
genetics	The study of heredity and the variation of inherited characteristics. <i>The effects of family genetics on the choice of career.</i>
hereditary	Inherited or inheritable by established rules (usually legal rules) of descent. <i>Cystic fibrosis is our most common fatal hereditary disease.</i>
inborn	Normally existing at birth. <i>An inborn defect in the formation of collagen.</i>
inclination	An attitude of mind especially one that favors one alternative over others. <i>My inborn inclination for things with moving parts.</i>

incline	An inclined surface connecting two levels. <i>She s inclined to gossip with complete strangers.</i>
influence	Shape or influence give direction to. <i>The influence of mechanical action.</i>
innate	Inborn; natural. <i>An innate talent.</i>
inspired	(of a person) displaying a creative impulse in the activity specified. <i>She was an inspired gardener.</i>
life	An account of the series of events making up a person s life. <i>She was beautiful and full of life.</i>
liking	A feeling of regard or fondness. <i>She developed a liking for gin.</i>
<u>living</u>	Pertaining to living persons. <i>What does he do for a living.</i>
neurology	Neurology the branch of medicine that deals with the nervous system and its disorders.
ophthalmology	The branch of medicine concerned with the study and treatment of disorders and diseases of the eye.
<u>organism</u>	The material structure of an organism. <i>The Church is a divinely constituted organism.</i>
<u>penchant</u>	A strong liking. <i>He has a penchant for adopting stray dogs.</i>
<u>predilection</u>	A predisposition in favor of something. <i>A predilection for expensive cars.</i>
predispose	Make susceptible. <i>This illness predisposes you to gain weight.</i>
<u>predisposition</u>	Susceptibility to a pathogen. <i>Factors including genetic predisposition.</i>
preference	A predisposition in favor of something. <i>My own preference is for good literature.</i>
<u>savor</u>	Give taste to. <i>Savor the soup.</i>
savour	The taste experience when a savoury condiment is taken into the mouth. <i>I wanted to savour every moment.</i>
<u>tendency</u>	An attitude of mind especially one that favors one alternative over others. <i>A tendency to be too strict.</i>
