| affective | Characterized by emotion. <i>Affective disorders.</i> |
| behavioral | Of or relating to behavior. <i>Behavioral sciences.</i> |
| biology | The study of living organisms, divided into many specialized fields that cover their morphology, physiology, anatomy, behaviour, origin, and distribution. <i>The biology of the Chesapeake Bay.</i> |
| biosphere | The regions of the surface and atmosphere of the Earth (or other planet) where living organisms exist. <i>The elliptical domed biosphere is the largest single span glasshouse in the world.</i> |
| character | A characteristic especially one that assists in the identification of a species. <i>Shady characters.</i> |
| clone | Propagate an organism or cell as a clone. <i>We have cloned DNA sequences added to the ends of the linear plasmid.</i> |
| genetically | In a way that relates to origin or development. <i>A genetically inherited condition.</i> |
| genetics | The study of heredity and the variation of inherited characteristics. <i>The effects of family genetics on the choice of career.</i> |
| hereditary | Inherited or inheritable by established rules (usually legal rules) of descent. <i>Cystic fibrosis is our most common fatal hereditary disease.</i> |
| inborn | Normally existing at birth. <i>An inborn defect in the formation of collagen.</i> |
| inclination | An attitude of mind especially one that favors one alternative over others. <i>My inborn inclination for things with moving parts.</i> |

| inspired | (of a person) displaying a creative impulse in the activity specified. <i>She was an inspired gardener.</i> |
| life | An account of the series of events making up a person s life. <i>She was beautiful and full of life.</i> |
| liking | A feeling of regard or fondness. <i>She developed a liking for gin.</i> |
| living | Pertaining to living persons. <i>What does he do for a living.</i> |
| neurology | Neurology the branch of medicine that deals with the nervous system and its disorders. |
| ophthalmology | The branch of medicine concerned with the study and treatment of disorders and diseases of the eye. |
| organism | The material structure of an organism. <i>The Church is a divinely constituted organism.</i> |
| penchant | A strong liking. <i>He has a penchant for adopting stray dogs.</i> |
| predilection | A predisposition in favor of something. <i>A predilection for expensive cars.</i> |
| predispose | Make susceptible. <i>This illness predisposes you to gain weight.</i> |
| predisposition | Susceptibility to a pathogen. <i>Factors including genetic predisposition.</i> |
| preference | A predisposition in favor of something. <i>My own preference is for good literature.</i> |
| savor | Give taste to. <i>Savor the soup.</i> |
| savour | The taste experience when a savoury condiment is taken into the mouth. <i>I wanted to savour every moment.</i> |
| tendency | An attitude of mind especially one that favors one alternative over others. <i>A tendency to be too strict.</i> |
