aeronautics	The science or practice of building or flying aircraft.
biochemistry	The processes and substances with which the science of biochemistry is concerned. <i>Abnormal brain biochemistry.</i>
biodiversity	The variety of plant and animal life in the world or in a particular habitat, a high level of which is usually considered to be important and desirable. <i>A high level of biodiversity is desirable.</i>
biology	The science that studies living organisms. <i>Human biology.</i>
biotech	The branch of molecular biology that studies the use of microorganisms to perform specific industrial processes. <i>Biotechnology produced genetically altered bacteria that solved the problem.</i>
biotechnology	The branch of engineering science in which biological science is used to study the relation between workers and their environments. <i>Biotechnology produced genetically altered bacteria that solved the problem.</i>
colloid	Relating to or characterized by a colloid or colloids.
earthly	Relating to humankind’s material existence as distinct from a spiritual or heavenly one. <i>Earthly love.</i>
ecological	Relating to or concerned with the relation of living organisms to one another and to their physical surroundings. <i>One of the world s worst ecological disasters.</i>
ecology	The branch of biology concerned with the relations between organisms and their environment. <i>It changed the ecology of the island.</i>

ecosystem	(in general use) a complex network or interconnected system. <i>Silicon Valley's entrepreneurial ecosystem.</i>
endangered	(of flora or fauna) in imminent danger of extinction. <i>An endangered species.</i>
engineering	The action of working artfully to bring something about. <i>Software engineering.</i>
ethology	The science of animal behaviour.
evolution	Biology the sequence of events involved in the evolutionary development of a species or taxonomic group of organisms. <i>The forms of written languages undergo constant evolution.</i>
evolutionary	Relating to a pattern of movements or manoeuvres. <i>Evolutionary tactics.</i>
life	A sentence of imprisonment for life. <i>He got life for killing the guard.</i>
mangrove	A tidal swamp which is dominated by mangroves.
meteorology	The branch of science concerned with the processes and phenomena of the atmosphere, especially as a means of forecasting the weather. <i>Overwintering would allow the team to investigate the island's meteorology.</i>
overland	Traveling or passing over land. <i>An overland trade route.</i>
pedagogics	The principles and methods of instruction.
polymer	A substance which has a molecular structure built up chiefly or completely from a large number of similar units bonded together, e.g. many synthetic organic materials used as plastics and resins.
science	A particular area of science. <i>Veterinary science.</i>
secular	A secular priest. <i>Secular drama.</i>
seduction	Enticing someone astray from right behavior. <i>The seductions of the mainland.</i>
speciation	The formation of new and distinct species in the course of evolution.
temporal	Characteristic of or devoted to the temporal world as opposed to the spiritual world. <i>Temporal matters of but fleeting moment.</i>
terrestrial	Operating or living or growing on land. <i>Increased ultraviolet radiation may disrupt terrestrial ecosystems.</i>

threatened

(of flora or fauna) likely in the near future to become endangered.
*The spotted owl is a **threatened** species not yet an endangered one.*

worldly

Of or concerned with material values or ordinary life rather than a spiritual existence.
