## Associations of "Bipolar" (30 Words)

<b>amnesia</b>	Partial or total loss of memory. <i>They were suffering from <b>amnesia</b>.</i>
<b>dementia</b>	A chronic or persistent disorder of the mental processes caused by brain disease or injury and marked by memory disorders, personality changes, and impaired reasoning.
<b>disturbed</b>	Emotionally unstable and having difficulty coping with personal relationships. <i><b>Disturbed</b> sleep.</i>
<b>epilepsy</b>	A disorder of the central nervous system characterized by loss of consciousness and convulsions.
<b>excitement</b>	Something that arouses a feeling of excitement. <i>Her cheeks were flushed with <b>excitement</b>.</i>
<b>forgetfulness</b>	Tendency to forget. <i>His <b>forgetfulness</b> increased as he grew older.</i>
<b>frenetic</b>	Excessively agitated; distraught with fear or other violent emotion. <i>A <b>frenetic</b> pace of activity.</i>
<b>frenzied</b>	Wildly excited or uncontrolled. <i>A <b>frenzied</b> attack.</i>
<a href="#">frenzy</a>	A state or period of uncontrolled excitement or wild behaviour. <i>Doreen worked herself into a <b>frenzy</b> of rage.</i>
<a href="#">hallucination</a>	A mistaken or unfounded opinion or idea. <i>He continued to suffer from horrific <b>hallucinations</b>.</i>
<b>hallucinatory</b>	Of or resembling a hallucination. <i>A <b>hallucinatory</b> drug.</i>
<b>hyperactivity</b>	Constantly active and sometimes disruptive behaviour, occurring primarily in children. <i>Pupils deprived of sleep tend to display <b>hyperactivity</b>.</i>

<b><u>hysteria</u></b>	An old-fashioned term for a psychological disorder characterized by conversion of psychological stress into physical symptoms (somatization) or a change in self-awareness (such as a fugue state or selective amnesia). <i>The anti Semitic <b>hysteria</b> of the 1890s.</i>
<b><u>ill</u></b>	Ill is often used as a combining form in a poor or improper or unsatisfactory manner not well. <i>How could I wish him <b>ill</b>.</i>
<b><u>illness</u></b>	Impairment of normal physiological function affecting part or all of an organism. <i>He died after a long <b>illness</b>.</i>
<b><u>impairment</u></b>	Damage that results in a reduction of strength or quality. <i>A degree of physical or mental <b>impairment</b>.</i>
<b><u>insane</u></b>	Extremely foolish; irrational. <i><b>Insane</b> laughter.</i>
<b>mania</b>	An excessive enthusiasm or desire; an obsession. <i>Many people suffering from <b>mania</b> do not think anything is wrong.</i>
<b>manic</b>	Frantically busy; hectic. <i>The pace is utterly <b>manic</b>.</i>
<b>migraine</b>	A severe recurring vascular headache; occurs more frequently in women than men. <i>An attack of <b>migraine</b>.</i>
<b>neurosis</b>	A relatively mild mental illness that is not caused by organic disease, involving symptoms of stress (depression, anxiety, obsessive behaviour, hypochondria) but not a radical loss of touch with reality. <i>Too much <b>neurosis</b> about a child's progress is unproductive.</i>
<b><u>oblivion</u></b>	The state of being unaware or unconscious of what is happening around one. <i>He sought the great <b>oblivion</b> of sleep.</i>
<b><u>paranoia</u></b>	A mental condition characterized by delusions of persecution, unwarranted jealousy, or exaggerated self-importance, typically worked into an organized system. It may be an aspect of chronic personality disorder, of drug abuse, or of a serious condition such as schizophrenia in which the person loses touch with reality. <i>Mild <b>paranoia</b> afflicts all prime ministers.</i>
<b><u>paranoid</u></b>	A person who is paranoid. <i><b>Paranoid</b> schizophrenia.</i>
<b>psychiatrist</b>	A medical practitioner specializing in the diagnosis and treatment of mental illness.

- psychosis** Any severe mental disorder in which contact with reality is lost or highly distorted.  
*The symptoms of **psychosis**.*
- schizophrenia** Any of several psychotic disorders characterized by distortions of reality and disturbances of thought and language and withdrawal from social contact.  
*Gibraltar s **schizophrenia** continues to be fed by colonial pride.*
- senile** (of a condition) characteristic of or caused by old age.  
***Senile** decay.*
- spinster** An unmarried woman, typically an older woman beyond the usual age for marriage.
- therapist** A person who treats psychological problems a psychotherapist.  
*Cost is one factor keeping them from the **therapist** s couch.*
