### **Definitions of "Birthday" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “birthday” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The date on which a person was born.*
- *An anniversary of the day on which a person was born (or the celebration of it).*
- *The day of a person's birth.*
- *The anniversary of the day on which a person was born, typically treated as an occasion for celebration and the giving of gifts.*
- *The anniversary of something's origin or foundation.*

**natal day** A region of eastern South Africa on the Indian Ocean.

## Associations of "Birthday" (30 Words)

<b><a href="#">anniversary</a></b>	The date on which a romance began in a previous month or week. <i>The 50th <b>anniversary</b> of the Battle of Britain.</i>
<b>annually</b>	Once a year; every year. <i>The prize is awarded <b>annually</b>.</i>
<b>bicentennial</b>	The 200th anniversary (or the celebration of it). <i>A year long celebration marking the <b>bicentennial</b> of Poe's birth.</i>
<b>blessing</b>	Grace said before or after a meal. <i>He gave the plan his <b>blessing</b> even before it was announced.</i>
<b>celebrate</b>	Reach (a birthday or anniversary). <i>He <b>celebrated</b> holy communion.</i>
<b>celebration</b>	The public performance of a sacrament or solemn ceremony with all appropriate ritual. <i>A birthday <b>celebration</b>.</i>

<b>celebratory</b>	Used or intended to publicly acknowledge a significant or happy day or event. <i>The scowl was replaced by <b>celebratory</b> smiles for the seven time series champion.</i>
<b>centenary</b>	The 100th anniversary (or the celebration of it). <i>The stunning vitality of a musician who is nearing his <b>centenary</b>.</i>
<b>centennial</b>	Of or relating to or completing a period of 100 years. <i>The show is a celebration of the museum s <b>centennial</b>.</i>
<b>ceremonial</b>	Relating to or used for formal religious or public events. <i>A <b>ceremonial</b> occasion.</i>
<b>ceremony</b>	A formal religious or public occasion, especially one celebrating a particular event, achievement, or anniversary. <i>He makes a <b>ceremony</b> of addressing his golf ball.</i>
<u><b>commemorate</b></u>	Recall and show respect for (someone or something). <i>This sculpture <b>commemorates</b> the victims of the concentration camps.</i>
<b>commemorative</b>	Acting as a memorial of an event or person. <i>A <b>commemorative</b> plaque.</i>
<b>congratulate</b>	Pride or congratulate oneself for an achievement. <i>She <b>congratulated</b> herself on her powers of deduction.</i>
<b>congratulation</b>	The action of expressing congratulations. <i><b>Congratulations</b> on a job well done.</i>
<u><b>feast</b></u>	Provide a feast or banquet for. <i>The Thanksgiving <b>feast</b>.</i>
<b>gala</b>	A gay festivity. <i>A <b>gala</b> performance by the Royal Ballet.</i>
<b>gift</b>	Present someone with a gift or gifts. <i>The goalkeeper <b>gifted</b> Liverpool their last minute winner.</i>
<u><b>invitation</b></u>	The action of inviting someone to go somewhere or to do something. <i>She threw the <b>invitation</b> away.</i>
<u><b>memorial</b></u>	A structure erected to commemorate persons or events. <i>A <b>memorial</b> to General Robert E Lee.</i>
<b>memorialize</b>	Be or provide a memorial to a person or an event. <i>We <b>memorialized</b> the Dead.</i>
<u><b>observance</b></u>	The act of noticing or paying attention. <i>The baby s motionless <b>observance</b> of me.</i>
<b>potlatch</b>	Hold a potlatch.



- reminder** A thing that causes someone to remember something.  
*He ignored his wife s **reminders**.*
- revelry** Unrestrained merrymaking.  
*Sounds of **revelry** issued into the night.*
- semiannual** Occurring or payable twice each year.
- sixteenth** One part in sixteen equal parts.
- tercentenary** The 300th anniversary (or the celebration of it).  
*His **tercentenary** year.*
- thanksgiving** (in North America) an annual national holiday marked by religious observances and a traditional meal. The holiday commemorates a harvest festival celebrated by the Pilgrim Fathers in 1621, and is held in the US on the fourth Thursday in November. A similar holiday is held in Canada, usually on the second Monday in October.  
*He offered prayers in **thanksgiving** for his safe arrival.*
- triennial** Occurring every third year or lasting 3 years.  
*The **triennial** meeting of the Association.*
