Definitions of "Birthday" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “birthday” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The date on which a person was born.*
- *An anniversary of the day on which a person was born (or the celebration of it.*
- *The day of a person's birth.*
- *The anniversary of the day on which a person was born, typically treated as an occasion for celebration and the giving of gifts.*
- *The anniversary of something's origin or foundation.*

Associations of "Birthday" (30 Words)

anniversary	The date on which a romance began in a previous month or week. <i>The 50th anniversary of the Battle of Britain.</i>
annually	Once a year; every year. <i>The prize is awarded annually.</i>
bicentennial	The 200th anniversary (or the celebration of it). <i>A year long celebration marking the bicentennial of Poe's birth.</i>
blessing	Grace said before or after a meal. <i>He gave the plan his blessing even before it was announced.</i>
celebrate	Reach (a birthday or anniversary). <i>He celebrated holy communion.</i>
celebration	The public performance of a sacrament or solemn ceremony with all appropriate ritual. <i>A birthday celebration.</i>

celebratory	Used or intended to publicly acknowledge a significant or happy day or event. <i>The scowl was replaced by celebratory smiles for the seven time series champion.</i>
centenary	The 100th anniversary (or the celebration of it). <i>The stunning vitality of a musician who is nearing his centenary.</i>
centennial	Of or relating to or completing a period of 100 years. <i>The show is a celebration of the museum s centennial.</i>
ceremonial	Relating to or used for formal religious or public events. <i>A ceremonial occasion.</i>
ceremony	A formal religious or public occasion, especially one celebrating a particular event, achievement, or anniversary. <i>He makes a ceremony of addressing his golf ball.</i>
<u>commemorate</u>	Recall and show respect for (someone or something). <i>This sculpture commemorates the victims of the concentration camps.</i>
commemorative	Acting as a memorial of an event or person. <i>A commemorative plaque.</i>
congratulate	Pride or congratulate oneself for an achievement. <i>She congratulated herself on her powers of deduction.</i>
congratulation	The action of expressing congratulations. <i>Congratulations on a job well done.</i>
<u>feast</u>	Provide a feast or banquet for. <i>The Thanksgiving feast.</i>
gala	A gay festivity. <i>A gala performance by the Royal Ballet.</i>
gift	Present someone with a gift or gifts. <i>The goalkeeper gifted Liverpool their last minute winner.</i>
<u>invitation</u>	The action of inviting someone to go somewhere or to do something. <i>She threw the invitation away.</i>
<u>memorial</u>	A structure erected to commemorate persons or events. <i>A memorial to General Robert E Lee.</i>
memorialize	Be or provide a memorial to a person or an event. <i>We memorialized the Dead.</i>
<u>observance</u>	The act of noticing or paying attention. <i>The baby s motionless observance of me.</i>
potlatch	Hold a potlatch.

- reminder** A thing that causes someone to remember something.
*He ignored his wife s **reminders**.*
- revelry** Unrestrained merrymaking.
*Sounds of **revelry** issued into the night.*
- semiannual** Occurring or payable twice each year.
- sixteenth** One part in sixteen equal parts.
- tercentenary** The 300th anniversary (or the celebration of it).
*His **tercentenary** year.*
(in North America) an annual national holiday marked by religious observances and a traditional meal. The holiday commemorates a harvest festival celebrated by the Pilgrim Fathers in 1621, and is held in the US on the fourth Thursday in November. A similar holiday is held in Canada, usually on the second Monday in October.
*He offered prayers in **thanksgiving** for his safe arrival.*

- triennial** Occurring every third year or lasting 3 years.
*The **triennial** meeting of the Association.*
