### **Definitions of "Bisect" as a verb**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “bisect” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Divide (a line, angle, or shape) into two exactly equal parts.*
- *Cut in half or cut in two.*
- *Divide into two parts.*



## Synonyms of "Bisect" as a verb (12 Words)

<b>cleave</b>	(of a cell) divide. <i>The large axe his father used to <b>cleave</b> wood for the fire.</i>
<b>cut in half</b>	Cut and assemble the components of.
<b>cut in two</b>	Have grow through the gums.
<b>disunite</b>	Part; cease or break association with. <i>The depiction of the protesters is designed to discredit and <b>disunite</b> the movement.</i>
<b><u>divide</u></b>	Make a division or separation. <i>Glass panels <b>divide</b> the bar from the TV room.</i>
<b>divide in two</b>	Make a division or separation.

<b>halve</b>	Divide by two divide into halves. <i>Pre tax profits nearly <b>halved</b> to 5 m.</i>
<b>separate</b>	Become separated into pieces or fragments. <i>The skins are <b>separated</b> from the juice before fermentation.</i>
<b>separate into two</b>	Become separated into pieces or fragments.
<b>sever</b>	Cut off from a whole. <i>His head was <b>severed</b> from his body.</i>
<b>split down the middle</b>	Separate into parts or portions.
<b>split in two</b>	Discontinue an association or relation; go different ways.



### Usage Examples of "Bisect" as a verb



- *A landscape of ploughland bisected by long straight roads.*
- *Bisect a line.*



## Associations of “Bisect” (30 Words)

- agape** Selfless love of one person for another without sexual implications (especially love that is spiritual in nature.  
*With mouth **agape**.*
- ambidextrous** Able to use the right and left hands equally well.  
*An **ambidextrous** surgeon.*
- androgynous** Relating to or exhibiting both female and male sex organs but with a predominantly female appearance.  
*A stunningly **androgynous** dancer.*
- angle** Move or be inclined at an angle.  
*Spring loaded hinges open the doors to any **angle** up to 90.*

<b>apart</b>	So as to be shattered; into pieces. <i>Quality sets it <b>apart</b>.</i>
<b>bachelor</b>	A bachelor apartment. <i>It s just one room a <b>bachelor</b>.</i>
<b>bisexual</b>	Sexually attracted to both sexes. <i>In fungi unisexual reproduction has been observed in several species that can also undergo traditional <b>bisexual</b> reproduction.</i>
<b>both</b>	(used with count nouns) two considered together; the two. <i>The film has won favour with <b>both</b> young and old.</i>
<b>buoyant</b>	Tending to float on a liquid or rise in air or gas. <i><b>Buoyant</b> balloons.</i>
<b>corner</b>	Establish a corner in a commodity. <i>A piano was in one <b>corner</b> of the room.</i>
<b>dating</b>	Use of chemical analysis to estimate the age of geological specimens.
<b>diagonal</b>	A set of entries in a square matrix running diagonally either from the upper left to lower right entry or running from the upper right to lower left entry. <i>The bars of light made <b>diagonals</b> across the entrance.</i>
<b>discrimination</b>	The ability to distinguish between different stimuli. <i>Young children have difficulties in making fine <b>discriminations</b>.</i>
<b>divide</b>	Separate (something) into portions and share out among a number of people. <i>Can you <b>divide</b> 49 by seven.</i>
<b>division</b>	A group of organisms forming a subdivision of a larger category. <i>No multiplication or <b>division</b> is necessary.</i>
<b>eros</b>	God of love; son of Aphrodite; identified with Roman Cupid.
<b>gender</b>	Members of a particular gender considered as a group. <i>Traditional concepts of <b>gender</b>.</i>
<b>heterosexual</b>	A heterosexual person someone having a sexual orientation to persons of the opposite sex. <i><b>Heterosexual</b> relationships.</i>
<b>homosexual</b>	Someone who practices homosexuality having a sexual attraction to persons of the same sex. <i><b>Homosexual</b> desire.</i>
<b>hypotenuse</b>	The longest side of a right-angled triangle, opposite the right angle.

<b>male</b>	An animal that produces gametes spermatozoa that can fertilize female gametes ova. <i>The valve has standard half inch threaded <b>male</b> ends.</i>
<b>perpendicular</b>	Perpendicular position or direction. <i>The great <b>perpendicular</b> face of the cliff.</i>
<b>prostitution</b>	Offering sexual intercourse for pay. <i>The sale of captives into slavery and <b>prostitution</b>.</i>
<b>segregation</b>	The action or state of setting someone or something apart from others. <i>An official policy of racial <b>segregation</b>.</i>
<b>split</b>	An instance or act of splitting or being split a division. <i><b>Splits</b> appeared in the decaying planks.</i>
<b>subculture</b>	A cultural group within a larger culture, often having beliefs or interests at variance with those of the larger culture. <i>In what ways does the social environment predispose certain individuals to join delinquent <b>subcultures</b>.</i>
