Definitions of "Bisect" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “bisect” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Divide (a line, angle, or shape) into two exactly equal parts.*
- *Cut in half or cut in two.*
- *Divide into two parts.*



Synonyms of "Bisect" as a verb (12 Words)

cleave	(of a cell) divide. <i>The large axe his father used to cleave wood for the fire.</i>
cut in half	Cut and assemble the components of.
cut in two	Have grow through the gums.
disunite	Part; cease or break association with. <i>The depiction of the protesters is designed to discredit and disunite the movement.</i>
<u>divide</u>	Make a division or separation. <i>Glass panels divide the bar from the TV room.</i>
divide in two	Make a division or separation.

halve

Divide by two divide into halves.
*Pre tax profits nearly **halved** to 5 m.*

separate

Become separated into pieces or fragments.
*The skins are **separated** from the juice before fermentation.*

separate into two

Become separated into pieces or fragments.

sever

Cut off from a whole.
*His head was **severed** from his body.*

split down the middle

Separate into parts or portions.

split in two

Discontinue an association or relation; go different ways.



Usage Examples of "Bisect" as a verb

- *A landscape of ploughland bisected by long straight roads.*
- *Bisect a line.*



Associations of “Bisect” (30 Words)

agape	Selfless love of one person for another without sexual implications (especially love that is spiritual in nature. <i>With mouth agape.</i>
ambidextrous	Able to use the right and left hands equally well. <i>An ambidextrous surgeon.</i>
androgynous	Relating to or exhibiting both female and male sex organs but with a predominantly female appearance. <i>A stunningly androgynous dancer.</i>
<u>angle</u>	Move or be inclined at an angle. <i>Spring loaded hinges open the doors to any angle up to 90.</i>

<u>apart</u>	So as to be shattered; into pieces. <i>Quality sets it apart.</i>
<u>bachelor</u>	A bachelor apartment. <i>It s just one room a bachelor.</i>
bisexual	Sexually attracted to both sexes. <i>In fungi unisexual reproduction has been observed in several species that can also undergo traditional bisexual reproduction.</i>
both	(used with count nouns) two considered together; the two. <i>The film has won favour with both young and old.</i>
buoyant	Tending to float on a liquid or rise in air or gas. <i>Buoyant balloons.</i>
<u>corner</u>	Establish a corner in a commodity. <i>A piano was in one corner of the room.</i>
dating	Use of chemical analysis to estimate the age of geological specimens.
diagonal	A set of entries in a square matrix running diagonally either from the upper left to lower right entry or running from the upper right to lower left entry. <i>The bars of light made diagonals across the entrance.</i>
discrimination	The ability to distinguish between different stimuli. <i>Young children have difficulties in making fine discriminations.</i>
<u>divide</u>	Separate (something) into portions and share out among a number of people. <i>Can you divide 49 by seven.</i>
division	A group of organisms forming a subdivision of a larger category. <i>No multiplication or division is necessary.</i>
eros	God of love; son of Aphrodite; identified with Roman Cupid.
<u>gender</u>	Members of a particular gender considered as a group. <i>Traditional concepts of gender.</i>
heterosexual	A heterosexual person someone having a sexual orientation to persons of the opposite sex. <i>Heterosexual relationships.</i>
homosexual	Someone who practices homosexuality having a sexual attraction to persons of the same sex. <i>Homosexual desire.</i>
hypotenuse	The longest side of a right-angled triangle, opposite the right angle.

male	An animal that produces gametes spermatozoa that can fertilize female gametes ova. <i>The valve has standard half inch threaded male ends.</i>
perpendicular	Perpendicular position or direction. <i>The great perpendicular face of the cliff.</i>
prostitution	Offering sexual intercourse for pay. <i>The sale of captives into slavery and prostitution.</i>
segregation	The action or state of setting someone or something apart from others. <i>An official policy of racial segregation.</i>
<u>split</u>	An instance or act of splitting or being split a division. <i>Splits appeared in the decaying planks.</i>
subculture	A cultural group within a larger culture, often having beliefs or interests at variance with those of the larger culture. <i>In what ways does the social environment predispose certain individuals to join delinquent subcultures.</i>
