excavation	The site of an archeological exploration. <i>There s an interesting excavation going on near Princeton.</i>
gold	Coins or other articles made of gold. <i>She claimed she was robbed of a gold.</i>
gray	English radiobiologist in whose honor the gray the SI unit of energy for the absorbed dose of radiation was named 1905 1965. <i>Gray flannel suit.</i>
green	Green color or pigment resembling the color of growing grass. <i>Tips on how to green your home.</i>
grey	Of a person having grey hair. <i>The workforce is greying rapidly.</i>

impregnate	Fertilize (an ovum). <i>An atmosphere impregnated with tension.</i>
magenta	A primary subtractive color for light a dark purple red color the dye for magenta was discovered in 1859 the year of the battle of Magenta. <i>Bright pink double flowers each lined in dark magenta.</i>
marbled	(of meat) having the lean part streaked with thin layers of fat. <i>Attractively marbled cloth or paper.</i>
maroon	A person who is stranded (as on an island). <i>Cold pinks purples and maroons.</i>
<u>mine</u>	Lay mines. <i>Mine ores and metals.</i>
mineshaft	A deep narrow vertical hole, or sometimes a horizontal tunnel, that gives access to a mine. <i>One member of this party almost vanished down a hidden disused mineshaft.</i>
mining	The process or industry of obtaining coal or other minerals from a mine. <i>Coal mining.</i>
perdition	Complete and utter ruin. <i>She used her last banknote to buy herself a square meal before perdition.</i>
<u>permeate</u>	Spread throughout (something); pervade. <i>His personality has begun to permeate through the whole organization.</i>
<u>pierce</u>	Make a hole into. <i>The needle pierced her flesh.</i>
pigmentation	Coloration of living tissues by pigment.
<u>pit</u>	An orchestra pit. <i>The pit lane.</i>
porous	(of a rock or other material) having minute spaces or holes through which liquid or air may pass. <i>He ran through a porous home defence to score easily.</i>
<u>quarry</u>	Extract stone or other materials from a quarry. <i>A British term for quarry is stone pit.</i>
<u>seep</u>	Pass gradually or leak through or as if through small openings. <i>Water began to seep through the soles of his boots.</i>
soot	Cover or clog something with soot. <i>You have previously sooted the underside of their plate by holding it over a candle.</i>
