- anthracite** A hard natural coal that burns slowly and gives intense heat.
*A wide range of colours from **anthracite** to blush pink.*
- black** Made black especially as with suffused blood.
*My soul is steeped in the **blackest** sin.*
- briquette** A block of compressed coal dust or peat used as fuel.
- burning** The act of burning something.
*The **burning** question of independence.*
- burnt** Treated by heating to a high temperature but below the melting or fusing point.
*Barricaded the street with **burnt** out cars.*
- carbon** A piece of carbon paper or a carbon copy.
*The level of **carbon** in the atmosphere has been consistently rising.*

cauterize	Burn, sear, or freeze (tissue) using a hot iron or electric current or a caustic agent. <i>I ll freeze the hand and cauterize the wound.</i>
char	Burn to charcoal. <i>The char will clean the carpet.</i>
charcoal	Charcoal used for drawing. <i>With a thick charcoal he traced out the line of the front.</i>
coal	Provide with a supply of coal. <i>A coal fire.</i>
collier	A ship carrying coal.
colliery	A workplace consisting of a coal mine plus all the buildings and equipment connected with it.
darken	Become dark or darker. <i>Misery darkened her gaze.</i>
excavation	The site of an archeological exploration. <i>The methods of excavation have to be extremely rigorous.</i>
fire	A fireplace in which a relatively small fire is burning. <i>I fired the straw.</i>
flame	Be in flames or aflame. <i>Jess s cheeks flamed.</i>
gasification	The process of changing into gas. <i>Coal gas is produced by the gasification of coal.</i>
hot	Make or become hot. <i>A hot scent.</i>
miner	A person who obtains units of a cryptocurrency by running computer processes to solve specific mathematical problems. <i>He worked as a miner at Wearmouth Colliery for 27 years.</i>
mineshaft	A deep narrow vertical hole, or sometimes a horizontal tunnel, that gives access to a mine. <i>One member of this party almost vanished down a hidden disused mineshaft.</i>
mining	The act of extracting ores or coal etc from the earth. <i>Coal mining.</i>
ore	A monetary subunit in Denmark and Norway and Sweden 100 ore equal 1 krona. <i>A good deposit of lead bearing ores.</i>
parch	Cause to wither or parch from exposure to heat. <i>His crops parched during the last two summers.</i>

- scorch** A plant disease that produces a browning or scorched appearance of plant tissues.
*A sports car was **scorching** along the expressway.*
- scurry** A situation of hurried and confused movement.
*The sled disappeared in a **scurry** of snow.*
- sear** Make very hot and dry.
***Sear** the chicken livers in a pan for a few minutes on each side.*
- singe** A surface burn.
*The fire had **singed** his eyebrows.*
- soot** Coat with soot.
*You have previously **sooted** the underside of their plate by holding it over a candle.*
- swarthy** Naturally having skin of a dark color.
***Swarthy** men with gleaming teeth.*
- tan** Convert animal skin into leather by soaking in a liquid containing tannic acid or by the use of other chemicals.
*Jenna managed to get an even golden **tan**.*
