# Synonyms of "Blacklist" as a noun (2 Words)

 $\boldsymbol{black\ book}$  The quality or state of the achromatic color of least lightness (bearing the least resemblance to white.

**shitlist** A list of people who are out of favor.

He was unaware of how deeply he had plunged on her **shitlist**.





## Usage Examples of "Blacklist" as a noun

- A blacklist of blocked websites.
- He was placed on a blacklist which meant he was unable to get credit.

## Blacklist as a Verb

#### Definitions of "Blacklist" as a verb

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "blacklist" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Put on a blacklist.
- Put on a blacklist so as to banish or cause to be boycotted.



#### Synonyms of "Blacklist" as a verb (9 Words)

Repudiate, nullify, or render void (a decree or contract.

Book early to **avoid** disappointment.

Withdraw from commercial or social relations with (a country,

**boycott** organization, or person) as a punishment or protest.

We will **boycott** all banks which take part in the loans scheme.

**consider undesirable** Look at attentively.

embargo Prevent commerce.

**Embargo**ed publications.

**ignore**Bar from attention or consideration.

He **ignore**d her outraged question.

ostracize Avoid speaking to or dealing with.

Ever since I spoke up my colleagues **ostracize** me.

place an embargo on Take a place in a competition; often followed by an ordinal.

**put an embargo on** Put into a certain place or abstract location.

**steer clear of** Direct (oneself) somewhere.

## Usage Examples of "Blacklist" as a verb

- Workers were blacklisted after being quoted in the newspaper.
- Many books were blacklisted by the Nazis.
- Blacklisted books.
