### Definitions of "Blade" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “blade” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The flat part of a tool or weapon that (usually) has a cutting edge.*
- *The broad, thin part of a leaf apart from the stalk.*
- *Especially a leaf of grass or the broad portion of a leaf as distinct from the petiole.*
- *A thin, flat metal runner on an ice skate.*
- *Hand shears used in sheep shearing.*
- *A long, narrow flake.*
- *A cut of beef from the shoulder blade.*
- *The flat cutting edge of a knife, saw, or other tool or weapon.*
- *A long, narrow leaf of grass or another similar plant.*
- *A prosthetic lower limb designed for athletes, consisting of a flattened length of carbon fibre with a long, curved section at the base.*
- *A shoulder bone in a joint of meat, or the joint itself.*
- *A broad flat body part (as of the shoulder or tongue).*
- *The part of the skate that slides on the ice.*
- *The flat part of the tongue behind the tip.*

- *The flat, wide section of an implement or device such as an oar or a propeller.*
- *A dashing or energetic young man.*
- *Something long and thin resembling a blade of grass.*
- *Flat surface that rotates and pushes against air or water.*
- *A cutting or thrusting weapon that has a long metal blade and a hilt with a hand guard.*
- *A sword.*
- *A dashing young man.*

<b>brand</b>	A brand name. <i>There s a new <b>brand</b> of hero in the movies now.</i>
<b>carver</b>	Makes decorative wooden panels. <i>An ivory <b>carver</b>.</i>
<b>cavalier</b>	A dashing and attentive man, especially one acting as a lady's escort.

<b>cutter</b>	A person who reduces or cuts down on something, especially expenditure. <i>A determined <b>cutter</b> of costs.</i>
<b>cutting tool</b>	A piece cut off from the main part of something.
<b>dandy</b>	An excellent thing of its kind. <i>His floppy handkerchiefs and antique cufflinks gave him the look of a <b>dandy</b>.</i>
<b>fop</b>	A man who is concerned with his clothes and appearance in an affected and excessive way.
<b>frond</b>	The leaf or leaflike part of a palm, fern, or similar plant. <i><b>Fron</b>s of bracken.</i>
<b><u>gallant</u></b>	A man who attends or escorts a woman. <i>He launches himself into a <b>gallant</b> s career of amorous intrigue.</i>
<b>leaf blade</b>	Hinged or detachable flat section (as of a table or door).
<b>man about town</b>	A male person who plays a significant role (husband or lover or boyfriend) in the life of a particular woman.
<b>oar</b>	An oarsman a rower. <i>She pulled hard on the <b>oars</b>.</i>
<b>scull</b>	A light narrow boat propelled with a scull or a pair of sculls. <i>Their current training programme involves two outings a day at the weekend in their single <b>sculls</b>.</i>
<b>spoon</b>	As much as a spoon will hold. <i>He added two <b>spoons</b> of sugar.</i>
<b><u>steel</u></b>	A rod of roughened steel on which knives are sharpened. <i><b>Steel</b> girders.</i>
<b>sweep</b>	A sweepstake. <i>The police finished their <b>sweep</b> through the woods.</i>
<b><u>sword</u></b>	A weapon with a long metal blade and a hilt with a hand guard, used for thrusting or striking and now typically worn as part of ceremonial dress. <i>Not many perished by the <b>sword</b>.</i>
<b>vane</b>	Mechanical device attached to an elevated structure; rotates freely to show the direction of the wind.

- clipper** An instrument for cutting or trimming small pieces off things.  
*The Cutty Sark a tea **clipper** built in 1869.*
- clipping** The act of clipping or snipping.  
*Press **clippings**.*
- cutting** Capable of cutting something.  
*Tax **cutting**.*

<b>dagger</b>	A moth with a dark dagger shaped marking on the forewing. <i>He drew his <b>dagger</b> and stabbed the leader.</i>
<b>fork</b>	A flash of forked lightning. <i>She <b>forked</b> her fingers.</i>
<b>gig</b>	An implement with a shaft and barbed point used for catching fish. <i>They played a <b>gig</b> in New Jersey.</i>
<b>harpoon</b>	Spear with a harpoon. <i><b>Harpoon</b> whales.</i>
<b>impale</b>	(of a coat of arms) adjoin (another coat of arms) on the same shield. <i>The <b>impaled</b> arms of her husband and her father.</i>
<b>javelin</b>	An athletic competition in which a javelin is thrown as far as possible. <i>His nearest rival in the <b>javelin</b>.</i>
<b>jig</b>	A piece of music for a jig typically in compound time. <i>He stood up and <b>jigged</b> in the cockpit.</i>
<b>knife</b>	Cut or move cleanly through something with a knife like action. <i>A shard of steel <b>knifed</b> through the mainsail.</i>
<b>lance</b>	Prick or cut open an abscess or boil with a lancet or other sharp instrument. <i>He affirms to have <b>lanced</b> darts at the sun.</i>
<b>lancet</b>	Shaped like a lancet arch. <i>A <b>lancet</b> clock.</i>
<b>mace</b>	An official who carries a mace of office.
<b>microtome</b>	An instrument for cutting extremely thin sections of material for examination under a microscope.
<b>razor</b>	Cut with a razor. <i>The tapered cut is <b>razored</b> to give movement.</i>
<b>saw</b>	Cut something using a saw. <i>The woman <b>sawed</b> off all my lovely hair.</i>
<b>scabbard</b>	A sheath for a sword or dagger or bayonet. <i>A ceremonial sword hung at his side in a gilded <b>scabbard</b>.</i>
<b>scissor</b>	Cut with or as if with scissors. <i>Frank could see shadowy legs <b>scissoring</b> under the thin skirt as she ran.</i>
<b>scissors</b>	Denoting an action in which two things cross each other or open and close like the blades of a pair of scissors. <i>A dummy <b>scissors</b> from David Thomas deceived the opposition.</i>
<b>scraper</b>	Any of various hand tools for scraping. <i>Residues should be removed with sharp <b>scrapers</b>.</i>

- sheathe** Cover with a protective sheathing.  
*Her legs were **sheathed** in black stockings.*
- snip** A small piece of anything especially a piece that has been snipped off.  
*She was **snipping** a few dead heads off the roses.*
- spear** A spearman.  
*The branch **speared** up into the air.*
- sword** Military power, violence, or destruction.  
*Not many perished by the **sword**.*
- trident** A three-pronged spear, especially as an attribute of Poseidon (Neptune) or Britannia.
- weapon** A means of gaining an advantage or defending oneself in a conflict or contest.  
*He used all his conversational **weapons**.*
- widget** A device or control that is very useful for a particular job.
