#### **Definitions of "Blade" as a noun**

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "blade" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- The flat part of a tool or weapon that (usually) has a cutting edge.
- The broad, thin part of a leaf apart from the stalk.
- Especially a leaf of grass or the broad portion of a leaf as distinct from the petiole.
- A thin, flat metal runner on an ice skate.
- Hand shears used in sheep shearing.
- A long, narrow flake.
- A cut of beef from the shoulder blade.
- The flat cutting edge of a knife, saw, or other tool or weapon.
- A long, narrow leaf of grass or another similar plant.
- A prosthetic lower limb designed for athletes, consisting of a flattened length of carbon fibre with a long, curved section at the base.
- A shoulder bone in a joint of meat, or the joint itself.
- A broad flat body part (as of the shoulder or tongue.
- The part of the skate that slides on the ice.
- The flat part of the tongue behind the tip.



- The flat, wide section of an implement or device such as an oar or a propeller.
- A dashing or energetic young man.
- Something long and thin resembling a blade of grass.
- Flat surface that rotates and pushes against air or water.
- A cutting or thrusting weapon that has a long metal blade and a hilt with a hand guard.
- A sword.
- A dashing young man.

cavalier	A dashing and attentive man, especially one acting as a lady's escort.



cutter	A person who reduces or cuts down on something, especially expenditure. <i>A determined cutter of costs.</i>
cutting tool	A piece cut off from the main part of something.
dandy	An excellent thing of its kind. <i>His floppy handkerchiefs and antique cufflinks gave him the look of a</i> <i>dandy</i> .
fop	A man who is concerned with his clothes and appearance in an affected and excessive way.
frond	The leaf or leaflike part of a palm, fern, or similar plant. <b>Frond</b> s of bracken.
<u>gallant</u>	A man who attends or escorts a woman. He launches himself into a <b>gallant</b> s career of amorous intrigue.
leaf blade	Hinged or detachable flat section (as of a table or door.
man about town	A male person who plays a significant role (husband or lover or boyfriend) in the life of a particular woman.
oar	An oarsman a rower. She pulled hard on the <b>oar</b> s.
scull	A light narrow boat propelled with a scull or a pair of sculls. Their current training programme involves two outings a day at the weekend in their single <b>scull</b> s.
spoon	As much as a spoon will hold. He added two <b>spoon</b> s of sugar.
<u>steel</u>	A rod of roughened steel on which knives are sharpened. <i>Steel girders.</i>
sweep	A sweepstake. The police finished their <b>sweep</b> through the woods.
<u>sword</u>	A weapon with a long metal blade and a hilt with a hand guard, used for thrusting or striking and now typically worn as part of ceremonial dress. <i>Not many perished by the</i> <b>sword</b> .
vane	Mechanical device attached to an elevated structure; rotates freely to show the direction of the wind.

# Associations of "Blade" (30 Words)

<u>brandish</u>	The act of waving. <b>Brandish</b> a sword.
<u>chisel</u>	Carve with a chisel. They <b>chisel</b> ed me out of my money.
clipper	An instrument for cutting or trimming small pieces off things. <i>The Cutty Sark a tea</i> <b>clipper</b> built in 1869.
clipping	The act of clipping or snipping. Press <b>clipping</b> s.
cutting	Capable of cutting something. <i>Tax <b>cutting</b>.</i>



<u>dagger</u>	A moth with a dark dagger shaped marking on the forewing. <i>He drew his <b>dagger</b> and stabbed the leader.</i>
fork	A flash of forked lightning. She <b>fork</b> ed her fingers.
gig	An implement with a shaft and barbed point used for catching fish. They played a <b>gig</b> in New Jersey.
harpoon	Spear with a harpoon. <i>Harpoon</i> whales.
impale	(of a coat of arms) adjoin (another coat of arms) on the same shield. The <b>impale</b> d arms of her husband and her father.
javelin	An athletic competition in which a javelin is thrown as far as possible. <i>His nearest rival in the javelin</i> .
jig	A piece of music for a jig typically in compound time. <i>He stood up and <b>jig</b>ged in the cockpit.</i>
<u>knife</u>	Cut or move cleanly through something with a knife like action. A shard of steel <b>knife</b> d through the mainsail.
lance	Prick or cut open an abscess or boil with a lancet or other sharp instrument. <i>He affirms to have lanced darts at the sun.</i>
lancet	Shaped like a lancet arch. A <b>lancet</b> clock.
mace	An official who carries a mace of office.
microtome	An instrument for cutting extremely thin sections of material for examination under a microscope.
razor	Cut with a razor. The tapered cut is <b>razor</b> ed to give movement.
<u>saw</u>	Cut something using a saw. The woman <b>saw</b> ed off all my lovely hair.
scabbard	A sheath for a sword or dagger or bayonet. A ceremonial sword hung at his side in a gilded <b>scabbard</b> .
scissor	Cut with or as if with scissors. Frank could see shadowy legs <b>scissor</b> ing under the thin skirt as she ran.
scissors	Denoting an action in which two things cross each other or open and close like the blades of a pair of scissors. <i>A dummy scissors from David Thomas deceived the opposition.</i>



sheathe	Cover with a protective sheathing. Her legs were <b>sheathe</b> d in black stockings.
snip	A small piece of anything especially a piece that has been snipped off. She was <b>snip</b> ping a few dead heads off the roses.
<u>spear</u>	A spearman. The branch <b>spear</b> ed up into the air.
<u>sword</u>	Military power, violence, or destruction. Not many perished by the <b>sword</b> .
trident	A three-pronged spear, especially as an attribute of Poseidon (Neptune) or Britannia.
<u>weapon</u>	A means of gaining an advantage or defending oneself in a conflict or contest <i>He used all his conversational weapons</i> .
widget	A device or control that is very useful for a particular job.
