<u>amaze</u>	Affect with wonder. He has been amaze d by the quality of the employees at the bank.
astonish	Surprise or impress (someone) greatly. It astonish ed her that he was so anxious.
astound	Affect with wonder. Her bluntness astound ed him.
<u>bare</u>	Just barely adequate or within a lower limit. An ordeal that would lay bare a troubled family background.
bathtub	A bath.
bemuse	Puzzle, confuse, or bewilder (someone. He was bemuse d by what was happening.
<u>bewilder</u>	Be a mystery or bewildering to. <i>His reaction had bewildered her.</i>
clean	Be cleanable. Led a clean life.
<u>daze</u>	Overcome as with astonishment or disbelief. <i>His mother s death left him in a daze.</i>
<u>empty</u>	Leave behind empty move out of. An empty room.
famish	Be hungry; go without food. They had famish ed the city into surrender.
immaculate	(in the Roman Catholic Church) free from sin. <i>The apartment was immaculate.</i>
impassive	Deliberately impassive in manner. <i>He remained impassive showing neither interest in nor concern for our plight.</i>



lave	Wash one's face and hands. The waves lave d the shore.
<u>pristine</u>	Immaculately clean and unused. Pristine mountain snow.
<u>spotless</u>	Completely neat and clean. A spotless white apron.
stun	Overcome as with astonishment or disbelief. <i>The news stunned her.</i>
stupefy	Astonish and shock. The offence of administering drugs to a woman with intent to stupefy her.
<u>stupor</u>	Marginal consciousness. Someone stole his wallet while he was in a drunken stupor .
surprise	Cause to be surprised. The announcement came as a complete surprise .
surprised	Taken unawares or suddenly and feeling wonder or astonishment. A surprised expression.
<u>tidy</u>	Of hair neat and tidy. <i>His scrupulously tidy apartment.</i>
uncontaminated	Not contaminated. Uncontaminated air and food.
unoccupied	(of a building, seat, etc.) not being occupied or used. Unoccupied France.
unpainted	Not having a coat of paint or badly in need of a fresh coat. Unpainted furniture.
unpolluted	Not defiled or corrupted. Unpolluted streams.
unspotted	Not marked with spots. It has an unspotted white throat.
unstained	Free from blemishes. An apron keeps his clothing unstained .
unsullied	(of reputation) free from blemishes. An unsullied reputation.
vacancy	Lack of intelligence or understanding. A vacancy for a shorthand typist.
