Associations of "Blankly" (30 Words)

amaze	Affect with wonder. <i>He has been amazed by the quality of the employees at the bank.</i>
astonish	Surprise or impress (someone) greatly. <i>It astonished her that he was so anxious.</i>
astound	Affect with wonder. <i>Her bluntness astounded him.</i>
bare	Just barely adequate or within a lower limit. <i>An ordeal that would lay bare a troubled family background.</i>
bathtub	A bath.
bemuse	Puzzle, confuse, or bewilder (someone). <i>He was bemused by what was happening.</i>
bewilder	Be a mystery or bewildering to. <i>His reaction had bewildered her.</i>
clean	Be cleanable. <i>Led a clean life.</i>
daze	Overcome as with astonishment or disbelief. <i>His mother's death left him in a daze.</i>
empty	Leave behind empty move out of. <i>An empty room.</i>
famish	Be hungry; go without food. <i>They had famished the city into surrender.</i>
immaculate	(in the Roman Catholic Church) free from sin. <i>The apartment was immaculate.</i>
impassive	Deliberately impassive in manner. <i>He remained impassive showing neither interest in nor concern for our plight.</i>

lave	Wash one's face and hands. <i>The waves laved the shore.</i>
<u>pristine</u>	Immaculately clean and unused. <i>Pristine mountain snow.</i>
<u>spotless</u>	Completely neat and clean. <i>A spotless white apron.</i>
stun	Overcome as with astonishment or disbelief. <i>The news stunned her.</i>
stupefy	Astonish and shock. <i>The offence of administering drugs to a woman with intent to stupefy her.</i>
<u>stupor</u>	Marginal consciousness. <i>Someone stole his wallet while he was in a drunken stupor.</i>
surprise	Cause to be surprised. <i>The announcement came as a complete surprise.</i>
surprised	Taken unawares or suddenly and feeling wonder or astonishment. <i>A surprised expression.</i>
<u>tidy</u>	Of hair neat and tidy. <i>His scrupulously tidy apartment.</i>
uncontaminated	Not contaminated. <i>Uncontaminated air and food.</i>
unoccupied	(of a building, seat, etc.) not being occupied or used. <i>Unoccupied France.</i>
unpainted	Not having a coat of paint or badly in need of a fresh coat. <i>Unpainted furniture.</i>
unpolluted	Not defiled or corrupted. <i>Unpolluted streams.</i>
unspotted	Not marked with spots. <i>It has an unspotted white throat.</i>
unstained	Free from blemishes. <i>An apron keeps his clothing unstained.</i>
unsullied	(of reputation) free from blemishes. <i>An unsullied reputation.</i>
vacancy	Lack of intelligence or understanding. <i>A vacancy for a shorthand typist.</i>
