- Characterized by profanity or cursing.
- Grossly irreverent toward what is held to be sacred.
- Sacrilegious against God or sacred things; profane.

#### Synonyms of "Blasphemous" as an adjective (10 Words)

blue	Of a bird or other animal having blue markings. Lonely and <b>blue</b> in a strange city.
disrespectful	Showing a lack of respect or courtesy; impolite. <b>Disrespectful</b> in the presence of his parents.
godless	Profane; wicked. A sceptical <b>godless</b> society.
impious	(of a person or act) wicked. <i>Impious</i> toward one s parents.
irreligious	Indifferent or hostile to religion, or having no religious beliefs. An <b>irreligious</b> man.



<u>irreverent</u>	Showing a lack of respect for people or things that are generally taken seriously. A certain <b>irreverent</b> gaiety and ease of manner.
<u>profane</u>	(of language) blasphemous or obscene. A talk that tackled topics both sacred and <b>profane</b> .
sacrilegious	Involving or committing sacrilege. A <b>sacrilegious</b> act.
ungodly	Characterized by iniquity; wicked because it is believed to be a sin. <i>Ungodly</i> lives of lust and pleasure.
<u>unholy</u>	Used to emphasize how bad something is; dreadful. A father killing his son is an act against nature <b>unholy</b> and loathsome.

- Blasphemous rites of a witches' Sabbath.
- Blasphemous and heretical talk.

# Associations of "Blasphemous" (30 Words)

caitiff	Despicably mean and cowardly. A <b>caitiff</b> knight.
corrupt	Corrupt morally or by intemperance or sensuality. Spoke a <b>corrupt</b> ed version of the language.
debauch	The practice of excessive indulgence in sex, alcohol, or drugs. Patrick looked utterly untouched by the previous night s <b>debauch</b> .
<u>demonic</u>	Fiercely energetic or frenzied. A <b>demonic</b> hurry.
deprave	Make (someone) immoral or wicked. This book would <b>deprave</b> and corrupt young children.
<u>desecrate</u>	Treat (a sacred place or thing) with violent disrespect. Many lanes are <b>desecrate</b> d with yellow lines.
despicable	Deserving hatred and contempt. A <b>despicable</b> crime.
evil	Of a force or spirit embodying or associated with the forces of the devil. <i>Evil deeds.</i>



flippant	Not showing a serious or respectful attitude. A <b>flippant</b> remark.
<u>heinous</u>	Extremely wicked, deeply criminal. A battery of <b>heinous</b> crimes.
<u>impertinent</u>	Not pertinent to a particular matter; irrelevant. Talk of rhetoric and strategy is <b>impertinent</b> to this process.
impious	Lacking due respect or dutifulness. <i>The emperor s <b>impious</b> attacks on the Church.</i>
iniquitous	Grossly unfair and morally wrong. <i>Iniquitous</i> deeds.
<u>insolent</u>	Unrestrained by convention or propriety- Los Angeles Times. <i>She hated the</i> <b>insolent</b> <i>tone of his voice.</i>
<u>irreverent</u>	Not revering god. <i>Irreverent</i> scholars mocking sacred things.
lewd	Driven by lust; preoccupied with or exhibiting lustful desires. <i>She began to gyrate to the music and sing a <b>lewd</b> song.</i>
libel	Defame someone by publishing a libel. She sued two newspapers for <b>libel</b> .
nauseating	Causing or able to cause nausea. The stench was <b>nauseating</b> .
nefarious	(typically of an action or activity) wicked or criminal. <i>Nefarious</i> schemes.
odious	Extremely unpleasant; repulsive. Consequences <b>odious</b> to those you govern.
pert	Characterized by a lightly pert and exuberant quality. She had a <b>pert</b> nose and deep blue eyes.
<u>profane</u>	Not holy because unconsecrated or impure or defiled. <i>He was an agnostic a <b>profane</b> man.</i>
ransack	Steal goods; take as spoils. Burglars <b>ransack</b> ed her home.
sacrilegious	Grossly irreverent toward what is held to be sacred. A <i>sacrilegious act</i> .
<u>sinister</u>	Evil or criminal. Bar <b>sinister</b> .
ungodly	Irreligious or immoral. <b>Ungodly</b> lives of lust and pleasure.



vicious	Marked by deep ill will; deliberately harmful. <b>Vicious</b> kicks.
villainous	Relating to, constituting, or guilty of wicked or criminal behaviour. <i>A villainous</i> smell.
wicked	Morally bad in principle or practice. <i>Despite the sun the wind outside was <b>wicked</b>.</i>
