### **Definitions of "Blasting" as an adjective**

- *Causing injury or blight; especially affecting with sudden violence or plague or ruin.*



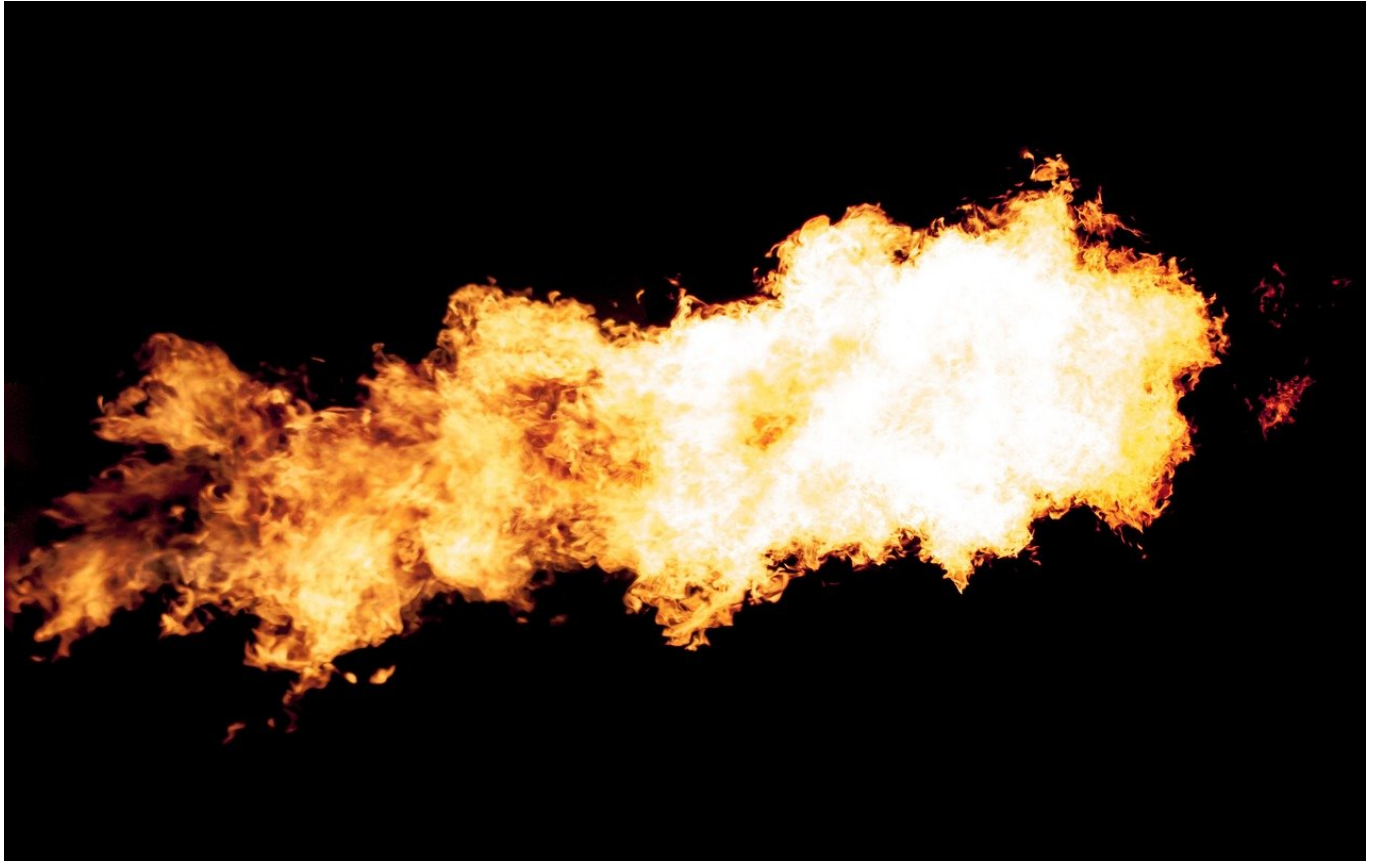
## Synonyms of "Blasting" as an adjective (2 Words)

- blaring** Unpleasantly loud and penetrating.  
*The **blaring** noise of trumpets.*
- ruinous** Costing far more than can be afforded.  
*A **ruinous** effect on the environment.*



## Usage Examples of "Blasting" as an adjective

- *Shut our ears against the **blasting** music from his car radio.*
- *The **blasting** effects of the intense cold on the budding fruit.*
- *The **blasting** force of the wind blowing sharp needles of sleet in our faces.*



## Associations of "Blasting" (30 Words)

<b>anthracite</b>	A dark grey colour. <i>The <b>anthracite</b> finish on these cupboard doors.</i>
<b>bomb</b>	Make someone homeless by destroying their home with bombs. <i>They <b>bombed</b> the city at dawn.</i>
<b>burst</b>	Burst outward usually with noise. <i><b>Bursts</b> of laughter.</i>
<b>coke</b>	Become coke. <i>Petroleum oils <b>coke</b> after distillation.</i>
<b>combust</b>	Cause to burn or combust. <i>We <b>combust</b> coal and other fossil fuels.</i>
<b>detonate</b>	Burst and release energy as through a violent chemical or physical reaction. <i>The bomb <b>detonated</b> at noon.</i>

<b>detonation</b>	The premature combustion of fuel in an internal combustion engine, causing pinking. <i>A series of deafening <b>detonations</b> was heard.</i>
<b>effusion</b>	Flow under pressure. <i>He studied the rates of <b>effusion</b> of gases.</i>
<u><b>erupt</b></u>	Erupt or intensify suddenly. <i>His skin <b>erupts</b> with hives.</i>
<b>eruption</b>	Symptom consisting of a breaking out and becoming visible. <i>The <b>eruption</b> of Vesuvius.</i>
<u><b>explode</b></u>	Drive from the stage by noisy disapproval. <i>His anger <b>exploded</b>.</i>
<u><b>explosion</b></u>	The noise caused by an explosion. <i>An <b>explosion</b> in the adder population.</i>
<b>explosive</b>	Likely to cause an outburst of anger or controversy. <i>Stocks of <b>explosives</b>.</i>
<b>firework</b>	(usually plural) a device with an explosive that burns at a low rate and with colored flames; can be used to illuminate areas or send signals etc. <i>A <b>firework</b> display.</i>
<b>flak</b>	Strong criticism. <i>He has been getting <b>flak</b> from certain quarters lately for pointing this out.</i>
<u><b>flare</b></u>	Become flared and widen usually at one end. <i>She could not control her <b>flare</b> of rage.</i>
<b>fulminate</b>	Come on suddenly and intensely. <i>He <b>fulminated</b> against the Republicans plan to cut Medicare.</i>
<b>grenade</b>	A glass receptacle containing chemicals which are released when the receptacle is thrown and broken, used for testing drains and extinguishing fires.
<u><b>gush</b></u>	Gush forth in a sudden stream or jet. <i>The tanker began to <b>gush</b> oil from its damaged hull.</i>
<u><b>ignite</b></u>	Start or maintain a fire in. <i>He lit a cigarette which <b>ignited</b> the petrol fumes.</i>
<b>implode</b>	Burst inward. <i>He lost money when the market <b>imploded</b>.</i>
<u><b>kindle</b></u>	Cause to start burning. <i>The dried grass of the prairie <b>kindled</b> spreading the flames for miles.</i>
<b>nebula</b>	A galaxy.



<b>ordnance</b>	Military supplies. <i>Unexploded <b>ordnance</b>.</i>
<b>outburst</b>	A sudden violent disturbance. <i>A very dramatic <b>outburst</b> of neutrons.</i>
<b>outpouring</b>	The pouring forth of a fluid. <i>A massive <b>outpouring</b> of high energy gamma rays.</i>
<b>pyrotechnic</b>	(usually plural) a device with an explosive that burns at a low rate and with colored flames; can be used to illuminate areas or send signals etc. <i><b>Pyrotechnic</b> keyboard virtuosity.</i>
<b>pyrotechnics</b>	The craft of making fireworks. <i>He thrilled his audience with vocal <b>pyrotechnics</b>.</i>
<b>supernova</b>	A star that explodes and becomes extremely luminous in the process.
<b>volcano</b>	A mountain or hill, typically conical, having a crater or vent through which lava, rock fragments, hot vapour, and gas are or have been erupted from the earth's crust. <i>Clare had been building up a silent <b>volcano</b> of resentment.</i>
