## Associations of "Blatantly" (30 Words)

<a href="#"><b>apparent</b></a>	Seeming real or true, but not necessarily so. <i>The committee investigated some <b>apparent</b> discrepancies.</i>
<b>barefaced</b>	With no effort to conceal. <i>His years of working <b>barefaced</b> breathing down dust.</i>
<a href="#"><b>brazen</b></a>	Harsh in sound. <i>A <b>brazen</b> hussy.</i>
<b>clamorous</b>	Conspicuously and offensively loud; given to vehement outcry. <i>The <b>clamorous</b> radical wing of the party.</i>
<a href="#"><b>conspicuous</b></a>	Clearly visible. <i>He showed <b>conspicuous</b> bravery.</i>
<b>effrontery</b>	Audacious (even arrogant) behavior that you have no right to. <i>One juror had the <b>effrontery</b> to challenge the coroner's decision.</i>
<b>egregious</b>	Conspicuously and outrageously bad or reprehensible. <i><b>Egregious</b> abuses of copyright.</i>
<b>flagrant</b>	Conspicuously and outrageously bad or reprehensible. <i>A <b>flagrant</b> violation of the law.</i>
<a href="#"><b>flaunt</b></a>	Display proudly; act ostentatiously or pretentiously. <i>His behavior was an outrageous <b>flaunt</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><b>gall</b></a>	A digestive juice secreted by the liver and stored in the gallbladder aids in the digestion of fats. <i>The trade in animal parts such as bear <b>galls</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><b>glaring</b></a>	Giving out or reflecting a strong or dazzling light. <i>A <b>glaring</b> error.</i>
<b>ignorant</b>	Discourteous or rude. <i>An <b>ignorant</b> man.</i>
<a href="#"><b>impertinent</b></a>	Improperly forward or bold. <i>An <b>impertinent</b> question.</i>

<b>impudent</b>	Marked by casual disrespect. <i>The student was kept in for <b>impudent</b> behavior.</i>
<b>insolence</b>	Rude and disrespectful behaviour. <i>She was sacked for <b>insolence</b>.</i>
<u><b>insolent</b></u>	Unrestrained by convention or propriety. <i>She hated the <b>insolent</b> tone of his voice.</i>
<u><b>manifest</b></u>	Record in a ship's manifest. <i>The buildings in Rome <b>manifest</b> a high level of architectural sophistication.</i>
<u><b>noisy</b></u>	Accompanied by or introducing random fluctuations that obscure the real signal or data. <i><b>Noisy</b> pressure groups.</i>
<b>obvious</b>	Easily perceived or understood; clear, self-evident, or apparent. <i>Unemployment has been the most <b>obvious</b> cost of the recession.</i>
<u><b>overt</b></u>	Open and observable; not secret or hidden. <i>In untreated cases <b>overt</b> psychosis may occur.</i>
<u><b>particularly</b></u>	Uniquely or characteristically. <i>The team's defence is excellent <b>particularly</b> their two centre backs.</i>
<b>pert</b>	Characterized by a lightly pert and exuberant quality. <i>A <b>pert</b> slightly plump girl called Rose.</i>
<u><b>presumptuous</b></u>	(of a person or their behaviour) failing to observe the limits of what is permitted or appropriate. <i>I hope I won't be considered <b>presumptuous</b> if I offer some advice.</i>
<b>proudly</b>	With a feeling of deep pleasure or satisfaction in one's own achievements, qualities, or possessions or those of someone with whom one is closely associated. <i>Ray watched <b>proudly</b> from the sidelines as his son won the singles title.</i>
<b>shameless</b>	(of a person or their conduct) characterized by or showing a lack of shame; barefaced or brazen. <i>A <b>shameless</b> imposter.</i>
<b>strident</b>	Presenting a point of view, especially a controversial one, in an excessively forceful way. <i>Public pronouncements on the crisis became less <b>strident</b>.</i>
<u><b>unashamed</b></u>	Expressed or acting openly and without guilt or embarrassment. <i>An <b>unashamed</b> emotionalism.</i>
<b>unrepentant</b>	Showing no regret for one's wrongdoings. <i>He was <b>unrepentant</b> and said that his comments were completely accurate.</i>

**vociferous** Expressing or characterized by vehement opinions; loud and forceful.
