## **Bleat as a Noun**

### **Definitions of "Bleat" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “bleat” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The sound of sheep or goats (or any sound resembling this).*
- *A person's weak or plaintive cry.*
- *The weak, wavering cry made by a sheep, goat, or calf.*
- *A complaint.*



## Synonyms of "Bleat" as a noun (8 Words)

- cry** A slogan used to rally support for a cause.  
*He kept a **cry** of hounds to hunt in the wilderness.*
- groan** An utterance expressing pain or disapproval.  
*Listen to everyone's moans and **groans**.*
- moan** A sound resembling a human moan.  
*The **moan** of the wind in the chimneys.*
- sniffle** The act of breathing heavily through the nose (as when the nose is congested).  
*She had a slight cough and a **sniffle**.*
- snivel** An act or sound of snivelling.  
*Lucy's torrent of howls weakened to a **snivel**.*
- sob** An act or sound of sobbing.  
*With a **sob** of despair she threw herself on to the bed.*
- wail** A cry of sorrow and grief.  
*The **wail** of an air raid siren.*
- whine** A complaining tone of voice.  
*There was a hint of a **whine** in Anna's voice.*







## Usage Examples of "Bleat" as a noun

- *His despairing bleat touched her heart.*
- *The distant bleat of sheep.*
- *They're hoping that I'll bow to their idiotic arrangements without a bleat.*



## Bleat as a Verb

### Definitions of "Bleat" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "bleat" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *(of a sheep, goat, or calf) make a characteristic weak, wavering cry.*
- *Talk whiningly.*
- *Speak or complain in a weak, querulous, or foolish way.*

- Cry plaintively.



## Synonyms of "Bleat" as a verb (17 Words)

<b>baa</b>	Cry plaintively.
<b>blat</b>	Make a bleating sound. <i>Horsemen on ugly steeds grunting and <b>blatting</b> and howling.</i>
<b>blate</b>	Cry plaintively.
<b>call</b>	Claim a specified privilege for oneself typically by shouting out a particular word or set phrase. <i>One subroutine may <b>call</b> another subroutine or itself.</i>
<b>carp</b>	Raise trivial objections.
<b>complain</b>	Express complaints discontent displeasure or unhappiness. <i>The plaintiff's lawyer <b>complained</b> that he defendant had physically abused his client.</i>



<b>cry</b>	Utter a sudden loud cry. <i>You ll <b>cry</b> tears of joy.</i>
<b>groan</b>	Say something in a despairing or miserable tone. <i>Families <b>groaning</b> under mortgage increases.</i>
<b>grouch</b>	Show one's unhappiness or critical attitude. <i>There s not a lot to <b>grouch</b> about.</i>
<b>grouse</b>	Hunt grouse.
<b>growl</b>	To utter or emit low dull rumbling sounds. <i>Keep out of this he <b>growled</b>.</i>
<b>grumble</b>	Make a low noise. <i>My appendix <b>grumbled</b> for years before it finally got serious.</i>
<b>maa</b>	(of a sheep, lamb, or goat) bleat.
<b>make a fuss</b>	Earn on some commercial or business transaction; earn as salary or wages.
<b>moan</b>	Make a sound resembling a human moan. <i>My friend always <b>moans</b> that I never make her a cake.</i>
<b>mutter</b>	Talk or grumble in secret or in private. <i>Back benchers were <b>muttering</b> about the next reshuffle.</i>
<b>snivel</b>	Cry or whine with snuffling. <i>Kate started to <b>snivel</b> looking sad and stunned.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Bleat" as a verb

- *The lamb was bleating weakly.*
- *It's no good just bleating on about the rising tide of crime.*
- *The lambs were bleating.*
