## Associations of "Bled" (30 Words)

<b>astrigent</b>	An astringent lotion applied to the skin to reduce bleeding from minor abrasions or as a cosmetic to make the skin less oily. <i>Fresh blackcurrants have a rather <b>astrigent</b> flavour.</i>
<b>bleeding</b>	The flow of blood from a ruptured blood vessel. <i>She looks so <b>bleeding</b> bored all day.</i>
<b>contusion</b>	A region of injured tissue or skin in which blood capillaries have been ruptured; a bruise. <i>A dark <b>contusion</b> on his cheek was beginning to swell.</i>
<b>cortex</b>	An outer layer of another organ or body part such as a kidney the renal cortex the cerebellum or a hair.
<b>cystic</b>	Of or relating to a normal cyst (as the gallbladder or urinary bladder). <i>Masses in the ovary may be <b>cystic</b> or solid.</i>
<a href="#">diarrhea</a>	Frequent and watery bowel movements; can be a symptom of infection or food poisoning or colitis or a gastrointestinal tumor.
<b>dyspepsia</b>	Indigestion.
<b>entrails</b>	Internal organs collectively (especially those in the abdominal cavity). <i>Digging copper out of the <b>entrails</b> of the earth.</i>
<a href="#">fester</a>	Ripen and generate pus. <i>Her wounds are <b>festering</b>.</i>
<a href="#">flatulence</a>	A state of excessive gas in the alimentary canal. <i>The <b>flatulence</b> characterizing his writings.</i>
<b>gastritis</b>	Inflammation of the lining of the stomach.
<b>hemophilia</b>	Congenital tendency to uncontrolled bleeding; usually affects males and is transmitted from mother to son.
<b>hemorrhage</b>	The flow of blood from a ruptured blood vessel.
<b>hemostatic</b>	Tending to check bleeding by contracting the tissues or blood vessels.

<b>henchman</b>	(in Scotland) the principal attendant of a Highland chief. <i>The dictator s <b>henchman</b>.</i>
<b>hurt</b>	Hurt the feelings of. <i>It s time to forgive past <b>hurts</b> and open your heart.</i>
<b>indigestion</b>	A disorder of digestive function characterized by discomfort or heartburn or nausea. <i>You know crisps give me <b>indigestion</b>.</i>
<b>lesion</b>	A region in an organ or tissue which has suffered damage through injury or disease, such as a wound, ulcer, abscess, or tumour.
<b>necrosis</b>	The death of most or all of the cells in an organ or tissue due to disease, injury, or failure of the blood supply.
<b>offal</b>	Viscera and trimmings of a butchered animal often considered inedible by humans. <i>The packing plant dumped its <b>offal</b> into the stream.</i>
<b>ooze</b>	The process of seeping. <i>I picked a fruit and watched the <b>ooze</b> of fig milk from the stem.</i>
<b>pain</b>	Cause mental or physical pain to. <i>The <b>pain</b> of loss.</i>
<b>parietal</b>	A parietal structure. <i><b>Parietal</b> lobe.</i>
<b>putrefy</b>	Become putrid; decay with an offensive smell. <i>The body was beginning to <b>putrefy</b>.</i>
<b>reflux</b>	(in a baby after feeding) the regurgitation of the contents of the stomach into the mouth. <i>Knowing which foods cause <b>reflux</b> is crucial in alleviating symptoms.</i>
<b>sap</b>	Drain someone of (strength or power). <i>Her illness had <b>sapped</b> her of energy and life.</i>
<b>scar</b>	Mark with a scar or scars. <i>This fossil bark is typified by its lozenge shaped leaf <b>scars</b>.</i>
<b>sore</b>	A cause or source of distress or annoyance. <i>He was <b>sore</b> from the long ride.</i>
<b>ulcer</b>	An open sore on an external or internal surface of the body, caused by a break in the skin or mucous membrane which fails to heal. Ulcers range from small, painful sores in the mouth to bedsores and serious lesions of the stomach or intestine. <i>He s a conman with an incurable <b>ulcer</b> called gambling.</i>
<b>wound</b>	The act of inflicting a wound. <i>A <b>wound</b> to the thigh.</i>
