Associations of "Bled" (30 Words)

astrigent	An astringent lotion applied to the skin to reduce bleeding from minor abrasions or as a cosmetic to make the skin less oily. <i>Fresh blackcurrants have a rather astrigent flavour.</i>
bleeding	The flow of blood from a ruptured blood vessel. <i>She looks so bleeding bored all day.</i>
contusion	A region of injured tissue or skin in which blood capillaries have been ruptured; a bruise. <i>A dark contusion on his cheek was beginning to swell.</i>
cortex	An outer layer of another organ or body part such as a kidney the renal cortex the cerebellum or a hair.
cystic	Of or relating to a normal cyst (as the gallbladder or urinary bladder). <i>Masses in the ovary may be cystic or solid.</i>
diarrhea	Frequent and watery bowel movements; can be a symptom of infection or food poisoning or colitis or a gastrointestinal tumor.
dyspepsia	Indigestion.
entrails	Internal organs collectively (especially those in the abdominal cavity). <i>Digging copper out of the entrails of the earth.</i>
fester	Ripen and generate pus. <i>Her wounds are festering.</i>
flatulence	A state of excessive gas in the alimentary canal. <i>The flatulence characterizing his writings.</i>
gastritis	Inflammation of the lining of the stomach.
hemophilia	Congenital tendency to uncontrolled bleeding; usually affects males and is transmitted from mother to son.
hemorrhage	The flow of blood from a ruptured blood vessel.
hemostatic	Tending to check bleeding by contracting the tissues or blood vessels.

henchman	(in Scotland) the principal attendant of a Highland chief. <i>The dictator s henchman.</i>
hurt	Hurt the feelings of. <i>It s time to forgive past hurts and open your heart.</i>
indigestion	A disorder of digestive function characterized by discomfort or heartburn or nausea. <i>You know crisps give me indigestion.</i>
lesion	A region in an organ or tissue which has suffered damage through injury or disease, such as a wound, ulcer, abscess, or tumour.
necrosis	The death of most or all of the cells in an organ or tissue due to disease, injury, or failure of the blood supply.
offal	Viscera and trimmings of a butchered animal often considered inedible by humans. <i>The packing plant dumped its offal into the stream.</i>
ooze	The process of seeping. <i>I picked a fruit and watched the ooze of fig milk from the stem.</i>
pain	Cause mental or physical pain to. <i>The pain of loss.</i>
parietal	A parietal structure. <i>Parietal lobe.</i>
putrefy	Become putrid; decay with an offensive smell. <i>The body was beginning to putrefy.</i>
reflux	(in a baby after feeding) the regurgitation of the contents of the stomach into the mouth. <i>Knowing which foods cause reflux is crucial in alleviating symptoms.</i>
sap	Drain someone of (strength or power). <i>Her illness had sapped her of energy and life.</i>
scar	Mark with a scar or scars. <i>This fossil bark is typified by its lozenge shaped leaf scars.</i>
sore	A cause or source of distress or annoyance. <i>He was sore from the long ride.</i>
ulcer	An open sore on an external or internal surface of the body, caused by a break in the skin or mucous membrane which fails to heal. Ulcers range from small, painful sores in the mouth to bedsores and serious lesions of the stomach or intestine. <i>He s a conman with an incurable ulcer called gambling.</i>
wound	The act of inflicting a wound. <i>A wound to the thigh.</i>
