## Associations of "Blend in" (30 Words)

<a href="#">alloy</a>	Make an alloy of. <i>An <b>alloy</b> of nickel bronze and zinc.</i>
<b>amalgam</b>	An alloy of mercury with another metal usually silver used by dentists to fill cavities in teeth except for iron and platinum all metals dissolve in mercury and chemists refer to the resulting mercury mixtures as amalgams. <i><b>Amalgam</b> fillings.</i>
<b>amalgamate</b>	Alloy (a metal) with mercury. <i>Numerous small British railway companies <b>amalgamated</b>.</i>
<b>blended</b>	Combined or mixed together so that the constituent parts are indistinguishable.
<b>blending</b>	The act of blending components together thoroughly. <i>Clever cultural <b>blendings</b>.</i>
<a href="#">coalesce</a>	Combine (elements) in a mass or whole. <i>The puddles had <b>coalesced</b> into shallow streams.</i>
<b>combination</b>	A sequence of numbers or letters used to open a combination lock. <i>Woollen <b>combinations</b>.</i>
<a href="#">composite</a>	A composite constructional material. <i>This soup is one of those <b>composite</b> dishes which you gradually build up.</i>
<a href="#">compound</a>	Composed of more than one partcompound flower heads. <i>A blackberry is a <b>compound</b> fruit.</i>
<a href="#">conflate</a>	Combine (two or more sets of information, texts, ideas, etc.) into one. <i>The urban crisis <b>conflates</b> a number of different economic political and social issues.</i>
<b>eclectic</b>	Someone who selects according to the eclectic method. <i>Universities offering an <b>eclectic</b> mix of courses.</i>
<b>filling</b>	The act of filling something. <i>Duvets with synthetic <b>fillings</b>.</i>

<b>fusible</b>	Capable of being melted and fused.
<b>harmonious</b>	Existing together in harmony. <i>The tailored clothes were <b>harmonious</b> with her military bearing.</i>
<b>indoors</b>	Into or within a building. <i>They went <b>indoors</b> and explored the house.</i>
<b>inner</b>	Innermost or essential. <i>The Doctor found the bull and held it to the close while Servis only scored <b>inner</b>s.</i>
<b>integrate</b>	Become one become integrated. <i>A fully equipped laboratory is being <b>integrated</b> into the development.</i>
<b>interior</b>	Relating to a country's internal affairs. <i><b>Interior</b> scenes.</i>
<b>intermingle</b>	Combine into one. <i>We don't <b>intermingle</b> much.</i>
<b>interweave</b>	Blend closely. <i>The branches met and interwove above his head.</i>
<b>inwardly</b>	With respect to private feelings. <i><b>Inwardly</b> seething he did as he was told.</i>
<b>lead</b>	An artificial watercourse leading to a mill. <i>It was a tangle of jumper cables and clip <b>leads</b>.</i>
<b><u>meld</u></b>	A thing formed by melding a combination. <i>Australia's winemakers have <b>melded</b> modern science with traditional art.</i>
<b><u>mingle</u></b>	Be all mixed up or jumbled together. <i>A smell which <b>mingled</b> disinfectant and soap.</i>
<b>mix</b>	Mix together different elements. <i>Peppercorns are sometimes <b>mixed</b> with other spices.</i>
<b><u>mixture</u></b>	An event that combines things in a mixture. <i>Form the <b>mixture</b> into a manageable dough.</i>
<b>roan</b>	A roan animal. <i>A <b>roan</b> horse.</i>
<b><u>shuffle</u></b>	A change of order or relative positions a reshuffle. <i>She <b>shuffled</b> her papers into a neat pile.</i>
<b>unite</b>	Act in concert or unite in a common purpose or belief. <i>His work <b>unites</b> theory and practice.</i>
<b>weld</b>	Forge an article by welding. <i>Steel plates were being <b>welded</b>.</i>
