## Bless as a Verb

### Definitions of "Bless" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “bless” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *(of God or some notional higher power) endow someone with (a particular cherished thing or attribute).*
- *Give a benediction to.*
- *Confer prosperity or happiness on.*
- *Make the sign of the cross over someone in order to call on God for protection; consecrate.*
- *(especially in Christian church services) call (God) holy; praise (God).*
- *Make the sign of the cross.*
- *Pronounce words in a religious rite in order to confer or invoke divine favour upon; ask God to look favourably on.*
- *Render holy by means of religious rites.*
- *Express or feel gratitude to; thank.*

- Used in expressions of surprise, endearment, gratitude, etc.

<b>adore</b>	Love and respect (someone) deeply. <i>He <b>adored</b> his mother.</i>
<b>ask god's favour for</b>	Require or ask for as a price or condition.
<b>ask god's protection for</b>	Direct or put; seek an answer to.
<b>be grateful for</b>	Be identical or equivalent to.
<b>bestow</b>	Bestow a quality on. <i><b>Bestow</b> an honor on someone.</i>
<b>consecrate</b>	Dedicate to a deity by a vow. <i>The present Holy Trinity church was <b>consecrated</b> in 1845.</i>
<b>dedicate</b>	Inscribe or address by way of compliment. <i>She <b>dedicated</b> her book to her parents.</i>

<b>dedicate to god</b>	Set apart to sacred uses with solemn rites, of a church.
<b>devote to god</b>	Set aside or apart for a specific purpose or use.
<b>endow</b>	Furnish with an endowment. <i>I had two brothers who were both better <b>endowed</b> than me.</i>
<b>entrust</b>	Assign the responsibility for doing something to (someone). <i>I ve been <b>entrusted</b> with the task of getting him safely back.</i>
<b>exalt</b>	Think or speak very highly of (someone or something). <i><b>Exalted</b> the humble shoemaker to the rank of King s adviser.</i>
<b>express gratitude for</b>	Indicate through a symbol, formula, etc.
<b>favour</b>	Treat (an injured limb) gently, not putting one's full weight on it. <i>Slashing public spending is a policy that few politicians <b>favour</b>.</i>
<b>furnish</b>	Be a source of; provide. <i>The proprietor has <b>furnished</b> the bedrooms in a variety of styles.</i>
<b>give a benediction for</b>	Transmit (knowledge or skills).
<b>give thanks for</b>	Accord by verdict.
<b>give thanks to</b>	Emit or utter.
<b>glorify</b>	Praise glorify or honor. <i><b>Glorify</b> one s spouse s cooking.</i>
<b>grace</b>	(of a person or thing) be an attractive presence in or on; adorn. <i>He is one of the best players ever to have <b>graced</b> the game.</i>
<b>hallow</b>	Honour as holy. <i>A theatre is a sort of church <b>hallowing</b> the land on which it sits by its very presence.</i>
<b>honour</b>	Accept (a bill) or pay (a cheque) when due. <i>Make sure the franchisees <b>honour</b> the terms of the contract.</i>
<b>invoke happiness on</b>	Summon into action or bring into existence, often as if by magic.
<b>make holy</b>	Compel or make somebody or something to act in a certain way.
<b>make sacred</b>	Reach in time.
<b>pay homage to</b>	Give money, usually in exchange for goods or services.
<b>pay tribute to</b>	Discharge or settle.
<b>praise</b>	Express one's respect and gratitude towards (a deity), especially in song. <i>The parents <b>praised</b> their children for their academic performance.</i>

<b>present</b>	Represent abstractly for example in a painting drawing or sculpture. <i>We <b>presented</b> the arguments to him.</i>
<b>provide</b>	Make a possibility or provide opportunity for permit to be attainable or cause to remain. <i>Neither will <b>provide</b> answers to these problems.</i>
<b>reverence</b>	Regard with feelings of respect and reverence consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of. <i>The many divine beings <b>reverenced</b> by Hindu tradition.</i>
<b><u>sanctify</u></b>	Render holy by means of religious rites. <i>A small shrine was built to <b>sanctify</b> the site.</i>
<b>set apart</b>	Arrange attractively.
<b>sign</b>	Mark or consecrate with the sign of the cross. <i>Things haven t changed since I <b>signed</b> in the summer.</i>
<b><u>venerate</u></b>	Regard with great respect; revere. <i>Philip of Beverley was <b>venerated</b> as a saint.</i>
<b><u>worship</u></b>	Show devotion to (a deity). <i>Many Hindus <b>worship</b> Shiva.</i>

- *The dying man blessed his son.*

- *She even bought me a little present—bless!*
- *Bless my soul, Alan, what are you doing?*
- *She silently blessed the premonition which had made her pack her best dress.*

- bible** A book regarded as authoritative in its field.
- blaspheme** Speak irreverently about God or sacred things.

<b>church</b>	Perform a special church rite or service for. <i>The separation of <b>church</b> and state.</i>
<b>consecrate</b>	Solemnly dedicated to or set apart for a high or sacred purpose. <i>After the priest had <b>consecrated</b> the bread and wine it was immortal and divine.</i>
<b>cursed</b>	Deserving a curse; sometimes used as an intensifier. <i>His <b>cursed</b> tidy mindedness.</i>
<b>deity</b>	The creator and supreme being (in a monotheistic religion such as Christianity). <i>A ruler driven by delusions of <b>deity</b>.</i>
<b>divinity</b>	The study of religion; theology. <i>Ancient Egyptians believed in the <b>divinity</b> of the Pharaohs.</i>
<b>glorify</b>	Praise glorify or honor. <i>A football video <b>glorifying</b> violence.</i>
<b>hallowed</b>	Greatly revered and honoured. <i>Jerusalem s <b>hallowed</b> soil.</i>
<b>holy</b>	Used in exclamations of surprise or dismay. <i>The <b>holy</b> month of Ramadan.</i>
<b>idolatrous</b>	Blindly or excessively devoted or adoring. <i>America s <b>idolatrous</b> worship of the auto.</i>
<b>orison</b>	A prayer.
<b>pantheistic</b>	Of or relating to pantheism.
<b>pantheon</b>	(antiquity) a temple to all the gods. <i>The deities of the Hindu <b>pantheon</b>.</i>
<b>pray</b>	Address a deity a prophet a saint or an object of worship say a prayer. <i>Ladies and gentlemen <b>pray</b> be seated.</i>
<b>priestess</b>	A woman priest.
<b>sacred</b>	Devoted exclusively to a single use or purpose or person. <i><b>Sacred</b> rites.</i>
<b>sacrosanct</b>	(especially of a principle, place, or routine) regarded as too important or valuable to be interfered with. <i>The individual s right to work has been upheld as <b>sacrosanct</b>.</i>
<b>saint</b>	Declare a dead person to be a saint. <i>The sandy shores of the River Nid where Holy Olaf s bones were laid to rest before he had been <b>sainted</b>.</i>
<b>sanctify</b>	Make legitimate or binding by a religious ceremony. <i>May God <b>sanctify</b> his soul.</i>

- theologian** Someone who is learned in theology or who speculates about theology.
- theological** Relating to the study of the nature of God and religious belief.
