- approval** The belief that someone or something is good or acceptable.  
*The road schemes have been given **approval**.*
- approving** The formal act of approving.
- benediction** The act of praying for divine protection.  
*He said the **benediction**.*
- boon** A desirable state.  
*The route will be a **boon** to many travellers.*
- grace** In Greek mythology three beautiful goddesses Aglaia Thalia and Euphrosyne believed to personify and bestow charm grace and beauty.  
*The payment had originally been due on April 1 but we had a **grace** period which expired in June.*
- thanksgiving** (in North America) an annual national holiday marked by religious observances and a traditional meal. The holiday commemorates a harvest festival celebrated by the Pilgrim Fathers in 1621, and is held in the US on the fourth Thursday in November. A similar holiday is held in Canada, usually on the second Monday in October.  
*He described the service as a **thanksgiving**.*

<b>approval</b>	The action of approving something. <i>Step parents need to win a child s <b>approval</b>.</i>
<b>benediction</b>	A prayer asking for divine blessing. <i>He said the <b>benediction</b>.</i>
<b>canonize</b>	Treat or regard as being above reproach or of great significance. <i>He was the last English saint to be <b>canonized</b> prior to the Reformation.</i>
<b>celebrate</b>	Assign great social importance to. <i>The film director was <b>celebrated</b> all over Hollywood.</i>
<b>commend</b>	Present as suitable for approval or acceptance recommend. <i>The emphasis on peace will <b>commend</b> itself to all.</i>
<b>commendation</b>	An award given for very good performance. <i>The book gives <b>commendations</b> for initiative.</i>
<b>congratulate</b>	Pride or congratulate oneself for an achievement. <i>The operators are to be <b>congratulated</b> for the service that they provide.</i>

<b>congratulation</b>	The action of expressing congratulations. <i>He began pumping the hand of his son in <b>congratulation</b>.</i>
<b>deify</b>	Worship or regard as a god. <i>These young men <b>deify</b> financial success.</i>
<b>elegance</b>	The quality of being graceful and stylish in appearance or manner. <i>She conveys an aura of <b>elegance</b> and gentility.</i>
<b>extol</b>	Praise enthusiastically. <i>He <b>extolled</b> the virtues of the Russian peoples.</i>
<b>favor</b>	A feeling of favorable regard. <i>That style is in <b>favor</b> this season.</i>
<b>glorify</b>	Praise glorify or honor. <i>A football video <b>glorifying</b> violence.</i>
<b>goddess</b>	A woman who is greatly admired, especially for her beauty. <i>Athena Nike <b>goddess</b> of victory.</i>
<b>grace</b>	In Greek mythology three beautiful goddesses Aglaia Thalia and Euphrosyne believed to personify and bestow charm grace and beauty. <i>The Virgin lived in a state of <b>grace</b>.</i>
<b>graceful</b>	Characterized by beauty of movement, style, form, or execution. <i>She was a tall girl slender and <b>graceful</b>.</i>
<b>gracefulness</b>	Beautiful carriage.
<b>holy</b>	(of a person) devoted to the service of God. <i>Saints and <b>holy</b> men.</i>
<b>honor</b>	Bestow honor or rewards upon. <i>A man of <b>honor</b>.</i>
<b>kindness</b>	Tendency to be kind and forgiving. <i>He thanked them for their <b>kindness</b> and support.</i>
<b>laud</b>	Praise. <i>All glory <b>laud</b> and honour to Thee Redeemer King.</i>
<b>meritorious</b>	Deserving reward or praise. <i>A lifetime of <b>meritorious</b> service.</i>
<b>nuptial</b>	A wedding. <i>Moments of <b>nuptial</b> bliss.</i>
<b>praise</b>	Express approval of. <i>He always appreciated <b>praise</b> for his work.</i>

Fourth Thursday in November in the United States; second Monday in October in Canada; commemorates a feast held in 1621 by the Pilgrims and the Wampanoag.
