According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “blimp” as a noun can have the following definitions:


- *Any elderly pompous reactionary ultranationalistic person (after the cartoon character created by Sir David Low).*
- *A small nonrigid airship used for observation or as a barrage balloon.*
- *A small airship or barrage balloon.*
- *A fat person.*
- *A soundproof cover for a cine camera.*
- *A pompous, reactionary type of person.*



Synonyms of "Blimp" as a noun (7 Words)

colonel blimp	A commissioned military officer in the United States Army or Air Force or Marines who ranks above a lieutenant colonel and below a brigadier general.
<u>conservative</u>	A member of a Conservative Party. <i>He was considered a conservative in his approach to Catholic teachings.</i>
diehard	A person who strongly opposes change or who continues to support something in spite of opposition. <i>A diehard Yankees fan.</i>
right-winger	A member of a right wing political party.
rightist	A person who supports the political views or policies of the right. <i>A national hero of the rightists.</i>
sausage	An object shaped like a sausage. <i>Silly sausage he teased.</i>

sausage balloon A small nonrigid airship used for observation or as a barrage balloon.

Associations of "Blimp" (30 Words)

administrate	Work in an administrative capacity; supervise or be in charge of. <i>The cost of administering VAT.</i>
<u>aircraft</u>	An aeroplane, helicopter, or other machine capable of flight.
airport	Relating to or denoting light popular fiction such as is offered for sale to travellers in airports. <i>An airport thriller.</i>
alien	Belonging to a foreign country. <i>Alien beings.</i>
ascendancy	Occupation of a position of dominant power or influence. <i>The ascendancy of good over evil.</i>
<u>astronaut</u>	A person trained to travel in a spacecraft. <i>The Russians called their astronauts cosmonauts.</i>
ballooning	Flying in a balloon. <i>He took up ballooning in 1907.</i>
butterfly	Flutter like a butterfly. <i>A social butterfly.</i>
centralize	Bring (activities or processes) together in one place. <i>The Treasury centralized all naval refitting work at Devonport.</i>
control	The activity of managing or exerting control over something. <i>This substance is controlled.</i>
<u>dominance</u>	The predominance of one or more species in a plant or animal community. <i>Her apparent dominance of her husband was really her attempt to make him pay attention to her.</i>
dominate	Be greater in significance than. <i>Hispanics predominate in this neighborhood.</i>
dominated	Harassed by persistent nagging.
<u>flight</u>	Shoot wildfowl in flight. <i>He flighted a free kick into the box.</i>
flotilla	A United States Navy fleet consisting of two or more squadrons of small warships. <i>A flotilla of cargo boats.</i>
govern	Require to be in a certain grammatical case, voice, or mood. <i>His belief in God governs his conduct.</i>

grasshopper	A cocktail made of creme de menthe and cream (sometimes with creme de cacao).
hangar	House an aircraft in a hangar. <i>The army choppers that were hangared out at Springs.</i>
helicopter	Fly somewhere in a helicopter. <i>They were helicoptering daily between Bath and London.</i>
jet	Fly a jet plane. <i>A private jet.</i>
<u>mastery</u>	Control or superiority over someone or something. <i>She played with some mastery.</i>
<u>plane</u>	Make even or smooth with or as with a carpenter s plane. <i>The plane of his forehead.</i>
refuel	Provide with additional fuel, as of aircraft, ships, and cars. <i>The chopper went to refuel.</i>
reign	The period during which a monarch is sovereign. <i>During the reign of Henry VIII.</i>
rudder	Application of a rudder in steering a boat ship or aircraft. <i>Bring the aircraft to a stall and apply full rudder.</i>
shuttle	Transport in a shuttle. <i>The nine o clock shuttle from Edinburgh.</i>
spacecraft	A craft capable of traveling in outer space; technically, a satellite around the sun.
spaceman	A person trained to travel in a spacecraft.
superintendence	Management by overseeing the performance or operation of a person or group. <i>Under his vigilant superintendence a building was erected.</i>
thermostat	Control the temperature with a thermostat.
