<b>arcadia</b>	A department of Greece in the central Peloponnese.
<b>beatitude</b>	A state of supreme happiness. <i>The expression of <b>beatitude</b> the religious sometimes adopt.</i>
<b>benediction</b>	A ceremonial prayer invoking divine protection. <i>He said the <b>benediction</b>.</i>
<b>blessedness</b>	A state of supreme happiness.
<b>blessing</b>	A ceremonial prayer invoking divine protection. <i>Enjoy the <b>blessings</b> of peace.</i>
<b>blissfulness</b>	A state of extreme happiness.
<b>cloud nine</b>	Any collection of particles (e.g., smoke or dust) or gases that is visible.
<b>delight</b>	A cause or source of great pleasure. <i>She took great <b>delight</b> in telling your story.</i>
<b>divine happiness</b>	A clergyman or other person in religious orders.

<b>divine rapture</b>	Terms referring to the Judeo-Christian God.
<u><b>ecstasy</b></u>	An amphetamine-based recreational drug having euphoric effects, typically taken in the form of a pill and particularly associated with clubbing and dance music subcultures. <i>There was a look of <b>ecstasy</b> on his face.</i>
<b>eden</b>	Any place of complete bliss and delight and peace.
<u><b>elation</b></u>	Great happiness and exhilaration. <i>Richard s <b>elation</b> at regaining his health was short lived.</i>
<u><b>euphoria</b></u>	A feeling of great (usually exaggerated) elation. <i>In his <b>euphoria</b> he had become convinced he could defeat them.</i>
<b>gladness</b>	Experiencing joy and pleasure.
<u><b>glory</b></u>	Praise, worship, and thanksgiving offered to a deity. <i>The <b>glory</b> of the sunrise.</i>
<b>happiness</b>	The state of being happy. <i>Tom s heart swelled with <b>happiness</b>.</i>
<b>heaven</b>	A place regarded in various religions as the abode of God (or the gods) and the angels, and of the good after death, often traditionally depicted as being above the sky. <i>Good <b>heavens</b>.</i>
<b>joy</b>	A thing that causes joy. <i>You ll get no <b>joy</b> out of her.</i>
<u><b>paradise</b></u>	Any place of complete bliss and delight and peace. <i>My idea of <b>paradise</b> is to relax on the seafront.</i>
<b>pleasure</b>	Enjoyment and entertainment, as opposed to necessity. <i>He puts duty before <b>pleasure</b>.</i>
<b>rapture</b>	A state of being carried away by overwhelming emotion- Charles Dickens. <i>Listening to sweet music in a perfect <b>rapture</b>.</i>
<b>sainthood</b>	Saints collectively. <i>The process of regularly conferring <b>sainthoods</b>.</i>
<b>saintliness</b>	The quality or state of being saintly; holiness. <i>Her selfless behaviour borders on <b>saintliness</b>.</i>
<b>seventh heaven</b>	One part in seven equal parts.
<u><b>utopia</b></u>	A work of fiction describing a utopia. <i>Misplaced faith in political <b>utopias</b> has led to ruin.</i>
<b>walking on air</b>	The act of traveling by foot.

*He **contented** himself with one glass of beer per day.*
- contented** Feeling or expressing happiness or satisfaction.  
*She gave a **contented** little smile.*
- contentment** A state of happiness and satisfaction.  
*He found **contentment** in living a simple life in the country.*
- delectation** A feeling of extreme pleasure or satisfaction.  
*They had all manner of rock n roll goodies for our **delectation**.*



<b><u>delightful</u></b>	Greatly pleasing or entertaining. <i>The comedy was <b>delightful</b>.</i>
<b>enjoyable</b>	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i>They had an <b>enjoyable</b> afternoon.</i>
<b><u>euphoria</u></b>	A feeling or state of intense excitement and happiness. <i>In his <b>euphoria</b> he had become convinced he could defeat them.</i>
<b>exult</b>	Feel extreme happiness or elation. <i>Who cannot <b>exult</b> in Spring.</i>
<b>exultant</b>	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>He waved to the <b>exultant</b> crowds.</i>
<b><u>glad</u></b>	Feeling happy appreciation. <i>A <b>glad</b> May morning.</i>
<b>gladden</b>	Make glad. <i>The high childish laugh was a sound that <b>gladdened</b> her heart.</i>
<b>gladness</b>	Experiencing joy and pleasure.
<b>happiness</b>	The state of being happy. <i>Tom's heart swelled with <b>happiness</b>.</i>
<b>happy</b>	Well expressed and to the point. <i>A <b>happy</b> marriage.</i>
<b><u>indescribable</u></b>	Defying expression or description. <i><b>Indescribable</b> beauty.</i>
<b>indulging</b>	The act of indulging or gratifying a desire.
<b>ineffable</b>	Not to be uttered. <i>The <b>ineffable</b> name of the Deity.</i>
<b>inexpressible</b>	(of a feeling) too strong to be described or conveyed in words. <i>A mood of <b>inexpressible</b> longing.</i>
<b>joviality</b>	A jovial nature.
<b><u>pleased</u></b>	Feeling or showing pleasure and satisfaction, especially at an event or a situation. <i>As he led the way he looked very <b>pleased</b> with himself.</i>
<b><u>pleasurable</u></b>	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i>Good printing makes a book more <b>pleasurable</b> to read.</i>
<b>satisfaction</b>	Fulfilment of one's wishes, expectations, or needs, or the pleasure derived from this. <i>The chef tasted the sauce with great <b>satisfaction</b>.</i>
<b>satisfactorily</b>	In a satisfactory manner. <i>The plan has not worked <b>satisfactorily</b>.</i>

Cause to sheer.

Defying expression or description.
