beatific	Marked by utter benignity; resembling or befitting an angel or saint. <i>A beatific smile.</i>
carefree	Cheerfully irresponsible. <i>We were young and carefree.</i>
contented	Willing to accept something; satisfied. <i>I was never contented with half measures.</i>
delighted	Filled with wonder and delight. <i>We were delighted to see her.</i>
<u>ecstatic</u>	Feeling great rapture or delight. <i>An ecstatic vision of God.</i>

elated	Full of high-spirited delight. <i>After the concert I felt elated.</i>
<u>enchanted</u>	Placed under a spell; bewitched. <i>The orchestra played classical favourites to an enchanted audience.</i>
<u>enraptured</u>	Feeling great rapture or delight.
enthusiastic	Having or showing great excitement and interest. <i>Enthusiastic crowds filled the streets.</i>
<u>euphoric</u>	Characterized by or feeling intense excitement and happiness. <i>A euphoric sense of freedom.</i>
<u>golden</u>	Marked by peace and prosperity. <i>A golden crown.</i>
happy	Having a sense of trust and confidence in (a person, arrangement, or situation). <i>A happy turn of phrase.</i>
<u>idyllic</u>	Suggestive of an idyll; charmingly simple and serene. <i>An idyllic spot for a picnic.</i>
in raptures	Currently fashionable.
in seventh heaven	Currently fashionable.
in transports	Currently fashionable.
<u>joyful</u>	Feeling, expressing, or causing great pleasure and happiness. <i>A joyful heart.</i>
<u>joyous</u>	Full of or characterized by joy. <i>Felt a joyous abandon.</i>
<u>overjoyed</u>	Extremely happy. <i>All of them were overjoyed at my success.</i>
palmy	Covered with palms. <i>A conference centre set among palmy trails.</i>
rapturous	Characterized by, feeling, or expressing great pleasure or enthusiasm. <i>He was greeted with rapturous applause.</i>
rhapsodic	Feeling great rapture or delight.
<u>thrilled</u>	Feeling intense pleasurable excitement.

beatitude	The blessings listed by Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount (Matt. 5:3-11). <i>The expression of beatitude the religious sometimes adopt.</i>
cheering	Providing freedom from worry. <i>Cheering news.</i>
contentment	Happiness with one's situation in life. <i>He found contentment in living a simple life in the country.</i>
delighted	Filled with wonder and delight. <i>We were delighted to see her.</i>
delightful	Causing delight; charming. <i>The comedy was delightful.</i>

<u>ecstatic</u>	A person subject to mystical experiences. <i>Ecstatic fans filled the stadium.</i>
elated	Exultantly proud and joyful; in high spirits. <i>Felt elated and excited.</i>
enjoyable	(of an activity or occasion) giving delight or pleasure. <i>The company was enjoyable.</i>
<u>enraptured</u>	Feeling great rapture or delight.
<u>euphoric</u>	Exaggerated feeling of well-being or elation. <i>A euphoric sense of freedom.</i>
exaltation	A flock of larks. <i>The exaltation of Jesus to the Father s right hand.</i>
exciting	Causing great enthusiasm and eagerness. <i>An exciting novel.</i>
<u>exhilarating</u>	Making lively and joyful. <i>An exhilarating two hour rafting experience.</i>
exultant	Triumphantly happy. <i>He waved to the exultant crowds.</i>
exultation	A feeling of extreme joy. <i>She laughs in exultation.</i>
<u>glad</u>	Any of numerous plants of the genus <i>Gladiolus</i> native chiefly to tropical and South Africa having sword-shaped leaves and one-sided spikes of brightly colored funnel-shaped flowers; widely cultivated. <i>I m really glad to hear that.</i>
gratifying	Giving pleasure or satisfaction. <i>The results were gratifying.</i>
happy	Well expressed and to the point. <i>They are happy to see me doing well.</i>
joy	A thing that causes joy. <i>Tears of joy.</i>
<u>joyful</u>	Feeling, expressing, or causing great pleasure and happiness. <i>Make a joyful noise.</i>
<u>joyous</u>	Full of or characterized by joy. <i>Felt a joyous abandon.</i>
laughing	Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. <i>Laughing children.</i>
<u>merry</u>	Offering fun and gaiety. <i>A merry chase.</i>

rapt

Filled with an intense and pleasurable emotion enraptured.

*The newly chosen minister declared he was **rapt** with his new portfolio.*

rapture

A state of being carried away by overwhelming emotion- Charles Dickens.

*The tabloids went into **raptures** about her.*

rapturous

Feeling great rapture or delight.

*He was greeted with **rapturous** applause.*

rejoicing

Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success.

***Rejoicing** crowds filled the streets on VJ Day.*

stimulating

That stimulates.

*A rich and **stimulating** working environment.*
