- *An unusually successful hit with widespread popularity and huge sales (especially a movie or play or recording or novel).*
- *A large bomb used to demolish extensive areas (as a city block).*

megahit An extremely successful film, television programme, song, etc.; frequently attributive.

smash hit A serious collision (especially of motor vehicles).

- bowdlerize** Edit by omitting or modifying parts considered indelicate.
*Every edition of his letters and diaries has been **bowdlerized**.*
- camcorder** A portable television camera and videocassette recorder.
- camera** Television equipment consisting of a lens system that focuses an image on a photosensitive mosaic that is scanned by an electron beam.
*A video **camera**.*
- casting** The act of creating something by casting it in a mold.
*Bronze **castings**.*
- cinema** The production of films as an art or industry.
*One of the giants of British **cinema**.*
- cinematic** Relating to the cinema.
*The **cinematic** feel of their video.*
- clip** Fasten or be fastened with a clip or clips.
*A gilt **clip** fastened her hair.*

documentary	(of film, television, radio, or photography) depicting a real-life event using images or interviews with people involved in the event. <i>Documentary evidence of regular payments from the company.</i>
dramaturgy	The theory and practice of dramatic composition. <i>Studies of Shakespeare s dramaturgy.</i>
enlarger	Photographic equipment consisting of an optical projector used to enlarge a photograph.
film	Record in film. <i>The coronation was filmed.</i>
flick	Cause to move with a flick. <i>He flicked his Bic.</i>
infotainment	A film or TV program presenting the facts about a person or event.
minstrel	A performer in a minstrel show. <i>The exaggerated dialect of blackface minstrels.</i>
movie	Films generally or the film industry. <i>We decided to go to the movies.</i>
nickelodeon	A cabinet containing an automatic record player; records are played by inserting a coin.
performer	A person who entertains an audience. <i>A circus performer.</i>
playback	The act of reproducing recorded sound. <i>We listened to several playbacks in the control room.</i>
premiere	Perform a work for the first time. <i>The premiere showing.</i>
preview	A showing of a film, exhibition, etc. before its official opening. <i>There was a small reception after the preview.</i>
projector	An optical instrument that projects an enlarged image onto a screen. <i>He was a tobacco grower and projector.</i>
recorder	A judge in certain courts. <i>A recorder of rural life.</i>
screen	Conceal protect or shelter someone or something with a screen or something forming a screen. <i>The Special Branch man remained hidden behind the screen for prosecution witnesses.</i>
screening	Fabric of metal or plastic mesh. <i>Nowhere is drug screening more common than in the federal criminal justice system.</i>

- theater** A region in which active military operations are in progress.
*He served in the Vietnam **theater** for three years.*
- theatrical** A performance of a play.
*One of the most **theatrical** figures in public life.*
- trilogy** A set of three literary or dramatic works related in subject or theme.
*J R R Tolkien s epic fantasy **trilogy** The Lord of the Rings.*
- troupe** A group of dancers, actors, or other entertainers who tour to different venues.
*A **troupe** of singers.*
- video** Film with a video camera.
*A **video** library.*
- viewing** The action of watching something on television.
*The owner may allow **viewing** by appointment.*
