bowdlerize	Edit by omitting or modifying parts considered indelicate. Every edition of his letters and diaries has been bowdlerize d.
camcorder	A portable television camera and videocassette recorder.
<u>camera</u>	Television equipment consisting of a lens system that focuses an image on a photosensitive mosaic that is scanned by an electron beam. <i>A video camera</i> .
casting	The act of creating something by casting it in a mold. Bronze casting s.
<u>cinema</u>	The production of films as an art or industry. One of the giants of British cinema .
cinematic	Relating to the cinema. The cinematic feel of their video.
<u>clip</u>	Fasten or be fastened with a clip or clips. A gilt clip fastened her hair.



documentary	(of film, television, radio, or photography) depicting a real-life event using images or interviews with people involved in the event. Documentary evidence of regular payments from the company.
dramaturgy	The theory and practice of dramatic composition. <i>Studies of Shakespeare s dramaturgy</i> .
enlarger	Photographic equipment consisting of an optical projector used to enlarge a photograph.
film	Record in film. <i>The coronation was filmed.</i>
flick	Cause to move with a flick. <i>He flicked his Bic.</i>
infotainment	A film or TV program presenting the facts about a person or event.
minstrel	A performer in a minstrel show. The exaggerated dialect of blackface minstrel s.
movie	Films generally or the film industry. <i>We decided to go to the movies.</i>
nickelodeon	A cabinet containing an automatic record player; records are played by inserting a coin.
performer	A person who entertains an audience. <i>A circus performer</i> .
playback	The act of reproducing recorded sound. We listened to several playback s in the control room.
premiere	Perform a work for the first time. <i>The premiere showing.</i>
preview	A showing of a film, exhibition, etc. before its official opening. There was a small reception after the preview .
projector	An optical instrument that projects an enlarged image onto a screen. <i>He was a tobacco grower and projector.</i>
recorder	A judge in certain courts. A recorder of rural life.
<u>screen</u>	Conceal protect or shelter someone or something with a screen or something forming a screen. The Special Branch man remained hidden behind the screen for prosecution witnesses.
<u>screening</u>	Fabric of metal or plastic mesh. Nowhere is drug screening more common than in the federal criminal justice system.



<u>theater</u>	A region in which active military operations are in progress. <i>He served in the Vietnam theater for three years.</i>
theatrical	A performance of a play. One of the most theatrical figures in public life.
<u>trilogy</u>	A set of three literary or dramatic works related in subject or theme. J R R Tolkien s epic fantasy trilogy The Lord of the Rings.
troupe	A group of dancers, actors, or other entertainers who tour to different venues. A troupe of singers.
video	Film with a video camera. A video library.
viewing	The action of watching something on television. The owner may allow viewing by appointment.
