- bellicose** Having or showing a ready disposition to fight.
***Bellicose** young officers.*
- bloody-minded** Stubbornly obstructive and unwilling to cooperate- Spectator.
- homicidal** Characteristic of or capable of or having a tendency toward killing another human being.
*A **homicidal** rage.*
- murderous** Extremely arduous or unpleasant.
*The most vicious and **murderous** acts of human aggression.*
- sadistic** Deriving pleasure or sexual gratification from inflicting pain on another.
*She took a **sadistic** pleasure in tormenting him.*
- sanguinary** Marked by eagerness to resort to violence and bloodshed.
*They lost heavily in the **sanguinary** campaigns that followed.*

violent

Marked by extreme intensity of emotions or convictions inclined to react violently fervid.

A **violent** attack.

warlike

(of plans, preparations, or munitions) directed towards or prepared for war.

Warlike preparations could be made quickly.

<u>atroc</u> ity	A highly unpleasant or distasteful object. <i>A textbook which detailed war atrocities.</i>
barbarism	Extreme cruelty or brutality. <i>She called the execution an act of barbarism.</i>
brutal	Punishingly harsh. <i>The brutal summer sun.</i>
brutish	Resembling or characteristic of a brute. <i>A dull and brutish man.</i>
cruel	Spoil or ruin (an opportunity or a chance of success). <i>Cruel tortures.</i>
devilry	Wicked activity. <i>Some spirit of devilry made me go on teasing her.</i>
<u>feroc</u> ious	Marked by extreme and violent energy. <i>A ferocious beating.</i>
<u>feroc</u> ity	The state or quality of being ferocious. <i>She hated him with a ferocity that astonished her.</i>
<u>gory</u>	Covered in blood. <i>A gory dagger.</i>
<u>heinous</u>	Extremely wicked, deeply criminal. <i>Heinous accusations.</i>
<u>horror</u>	A thing causing a feeling of horror. <i>Photographs showed the horror of the tragedy.</i>
inhuman	Without compunction or human feeling. <i>Something dark and inhuman in form.</i>
inhumane	Without compassion for misery or suffering; cruel. <i>Humans are innately inhumane this explains much of the misery and suffering in the world.</i>
internecine	Relating to conflict within a group. <i>The region s history of savage internecine warfare.</i>
<u>merciless</u>	Having or showing no mercy. <i>Gave him a merciless beating.</i>
<u>oppression</u>	Mental pressure or distress. <i>The tyrant s oppression of the people.</i>
pitiless	(especially of weather) unrelentingly harsh or severe. <i>A night of pitiless rain.</i>

rampage	A period of violent and uncontrollable behaviour by a group of people. <i>Several thousand demonstrators rampaged through the city.</i>
repression	The restraint, prevention, or inhibition of a feeling, quality, etc. <i>The long repression of Christian sects.</i>
ruthless	Without mercy or pity. <i>A ruthless manipulator.</i>
ruthlessness	Feelings of extreme heartlessness. <i>The real world ruthlessness of business.</i>
sanguinary	Marked by eagerness to resort to violence and bloodshed. <i>Went after the collaborators with a sanguinary fury that drenched the land with blood.</i>
savage	Attack brutally and fiercely. <i>The mother of one of the victims has described his assailants as savages.</i>
shambles	A building where animals are butchered. <i>The shambles where the animals were slaughtered.</i>
tyrant	A tyrant flycatcher. <i>His father was a tyrant.</i>
vampire	(in European folklore) a corpse supposed to leave its grave at night to drink the blood of the living by biting their necks with long pointed canine teeth. <i>The protectionist vampires in the Congress.</i>
warmonger	A person who advocates war or warlike policies.
warmth	Intensity of emotion. <i>She smiled with real warmth.</i>
