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## Associations of "Blown away" (30 Words)

<a href="#">apart</a>	Away from another or others. <i>Preserved because they inhabited a place <b>apart</b>.</i>
<a href="#">aside</a>	On or to one side. <i>Shakespeare s use of <b>asides</b> and soliloquies.</i>
<a href="#">astray</a>	Away from the correct path or direction. <i>We went <b>astray</b> but a man redirected us.</i>
<a href="#">breeze</a>	A thing that is easy to do or accomplish. <i>Tantalizing cooking smells wafted on the evening <b>breeze</b>.</i>
<b>detached</b>	Being or feeling set or kept apart from others- Sherwood Anderson. <i>She may be <b>detached</b> or even unfeeling but at least she s not hypocritically effusive.</i>
<b>digressive</b>	Characterized by digression; tending to depart from the subject. <i>A <b>digressive</b> allusion to the day of the week.</i>
<b>excursive</b>	Tending to deviate from a course or activity; digressive. <i>His <b>excursive</b> remarks.</i>
<a href="#">exhale</a>	Expel air. <i>She sat back and <b>exhaled</b> deeply.</i>
<a href="#">far</a>	A terrorist organization that seeks to overthrow the government dominated by Tutsi and to institute Hutu control again. <i><b>Far</b> corners of the earth.</i>
<b>farther</b>	To or at a greater distance in time or space farther is used more frequently than further in this physical sense. <i>They live in the <b>farther</b> house.</i>
<a href="#">going</a>	Existing or available; to be had. <i>She is a big support when the <b>going</b> gets tough.</i>
<b>heave</b>	An involuntary spasm of ineffectual vomiting. <i>He <b>heaved</b> himself out of bed.</i>

<b>inaccessible</b>	Not capable of being obtained. <i>High culture is largely <b>inaccessible</b> to the masses.</i>
<b>irrelevant</b>	Having no bearing on or connection with the subject at issue. <i><b>Irrelevant</b> allegations.</i>
<b>isolated</b>	Far away from other places, buildings, or people; remote. <i><b>Isolated</b> farms and villages.</i>
<b>out</b>	Directed outward or serving to direct something outward. <i>He walked <b>out</b> into the street.</i>
<b>out-of-town</b>	The people living in a municipality smaller than a city.
<b>outpost</b>	A military post stationed at a distance from the main body of troops. <i>A few scattered <b>outposts</b> along the west coast.</i>
<b>pant</b>	Run or go in a specified direction while panting. <i>We ll never have time she <b>panted</b>.</i>
<b>puff</b>	A light pastry case typically one made of puff pastry containing a sweet or savoury filling. <i>He <b>puffed</b> on his pipe contentedly.</i>
<b>rambling</b>	Spreading out in different directions or distributed irregularly. <i><b>Rambling</b> forest paths.</i>
<b>remote</b>	A remote control device. <i>A <b>remote</b> Welsh valley.</i>
<b>rove</b>	A journey, especially one with no specific destination; an act of wandering. <i>A new exhibit will electrify campuses on its national <b>rove</b>.</i>
<b>separated</b>	Separated at the joint. <i>A <b>separated</b> shoulder.</i>
<b>sidetrack</b>	Divert (a well or borehole) to reach a productive deposit or to avoid an obstruction. <i>He does not let himself get <b>sidetracked</b> by fads and trends.</i>
<b>solitary</b>	Confinement of a prisoner in isolation from other prisoners. <i>A <b>solitary</b> wasp.</i>
<b>stray</b>	A stray person or thing especially a domestic animal. <i><b>Stray</b> dogs.</i>
<b>waft</b>	(with reference to a scent, sound, etc.) pass or cause to pass gently through the air. <i>Each breeze would <b>waft</b> pollen round the house.</i>
<b>yon</b>	At or in an indicated usually distant place yon is archaic and dialectal. <i>The hills <b>yonder</b>.</i>
<b>zephyr</b>	A fine cotton gingham.
