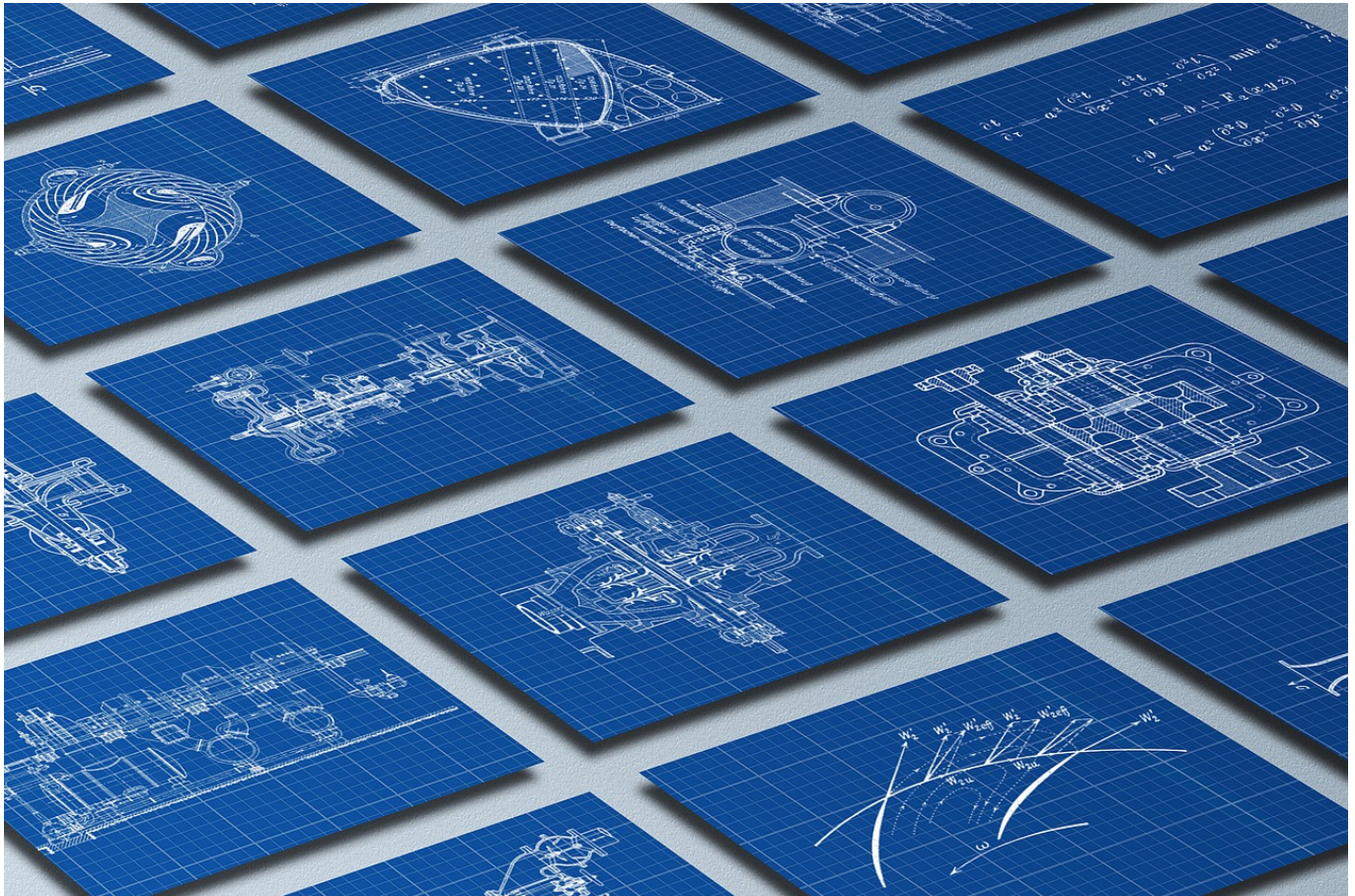

- exemplar** Something to be imitated.
*The place is an **exemplar** of multicultural Britain.*

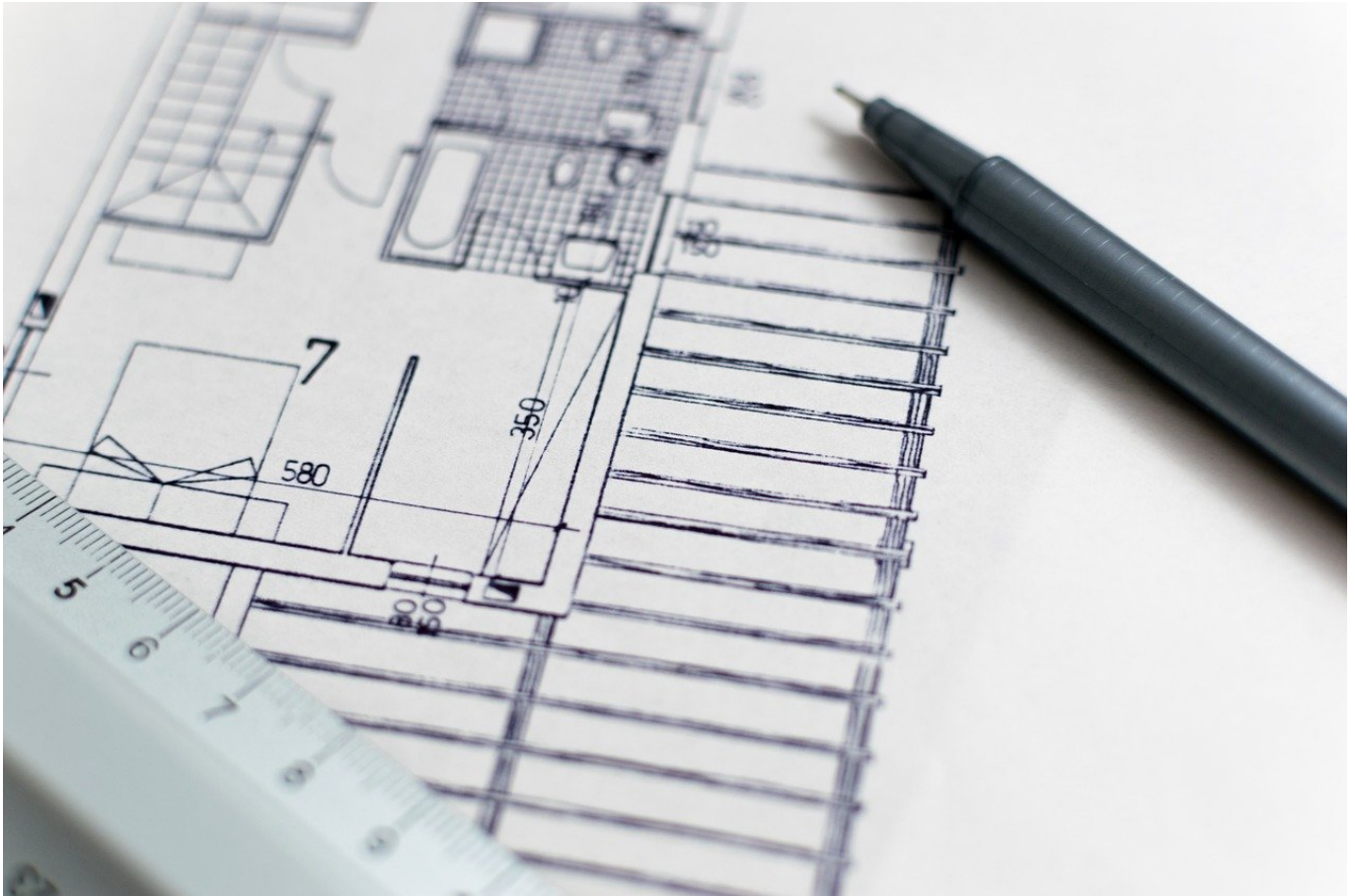

| framework | A structure supporting or containing something. <i>The theoretical framework of political sociology.</i> |
| guide | A model or standard for making comparisons. <i>His spiritual guide.</i> |
| layout | The way in which text or pictures are set out on a page. <i>A model railway layout.</i> |
| map | A diagrammatic representation of an area of land or sea showing physical features, cities, roads, etc. <i>She went inside to check a star map.</i> |
| model | A hypothetical description of a complex entity or process. <i>A well known fashion model.</i> |
| outline | A general description or plan showing the essential features of something but not the detail. <i>An outline proposal.</i> |
| paradigm | The class of all items that can be substituted into the same position or slot in a grammatical sentence are in paradigmatic relation with one another. <i>He framed the problem within the psychoanalytic paradigm.</i> |
| pattern | A wooden or metal model from which a mould is made for a casting. <i>The school is located a few kilometers away and is run on the pattern of other army schools.</i> |
| pilot | A person qualified to guide ships through difficult waters going into or out of a harbor. <i>Many expected him to get the job as Desert Orchid's pilot.</i> |
| plan | A drawing or diagram made by projection on a horizontal plane especially one showing the layout of a building or one floor of a building. <i>A street plan.</i> |
| prototype | A standard or typical example. <i>The firm is testing a prototype of the weapon.</i> |
| recipe | Directions for making something. <i>Sky high interest rates are a recipe for disaster.</i> |
| representation | A body of legislators that serve in behalf of some constituency. <i>The Law Society will make representations to the Lord Chancellor.</i> |
| sample | A portion drawn from a population, the study of which is intended to lead to statistical estimates of the attributes of the whole population. <i>Samples of products for evaluation.</i> |
| scale drawing | A metal sheathing of uniform thickness (such as the shield attached to an artillery piece to protect the gunners). |

sketch

A comical or amusing person or thing.
*A hilarious **sketch** for their latest BBC series.*

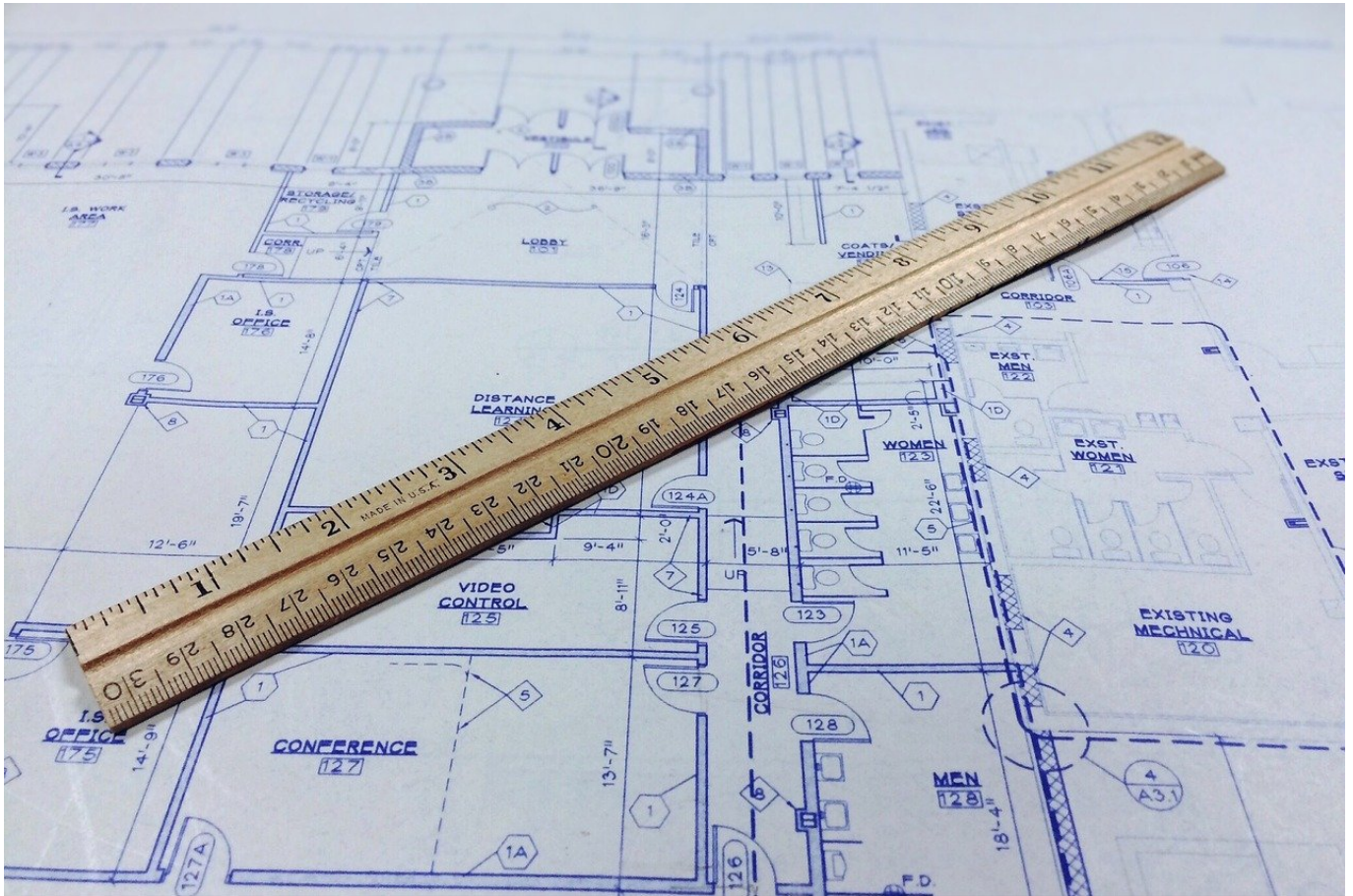
template

A preset format for a document or file.
*Secondary structure in the **template** strand is eliminated.*

- *The scheme was a blueprint for future development programmes.*

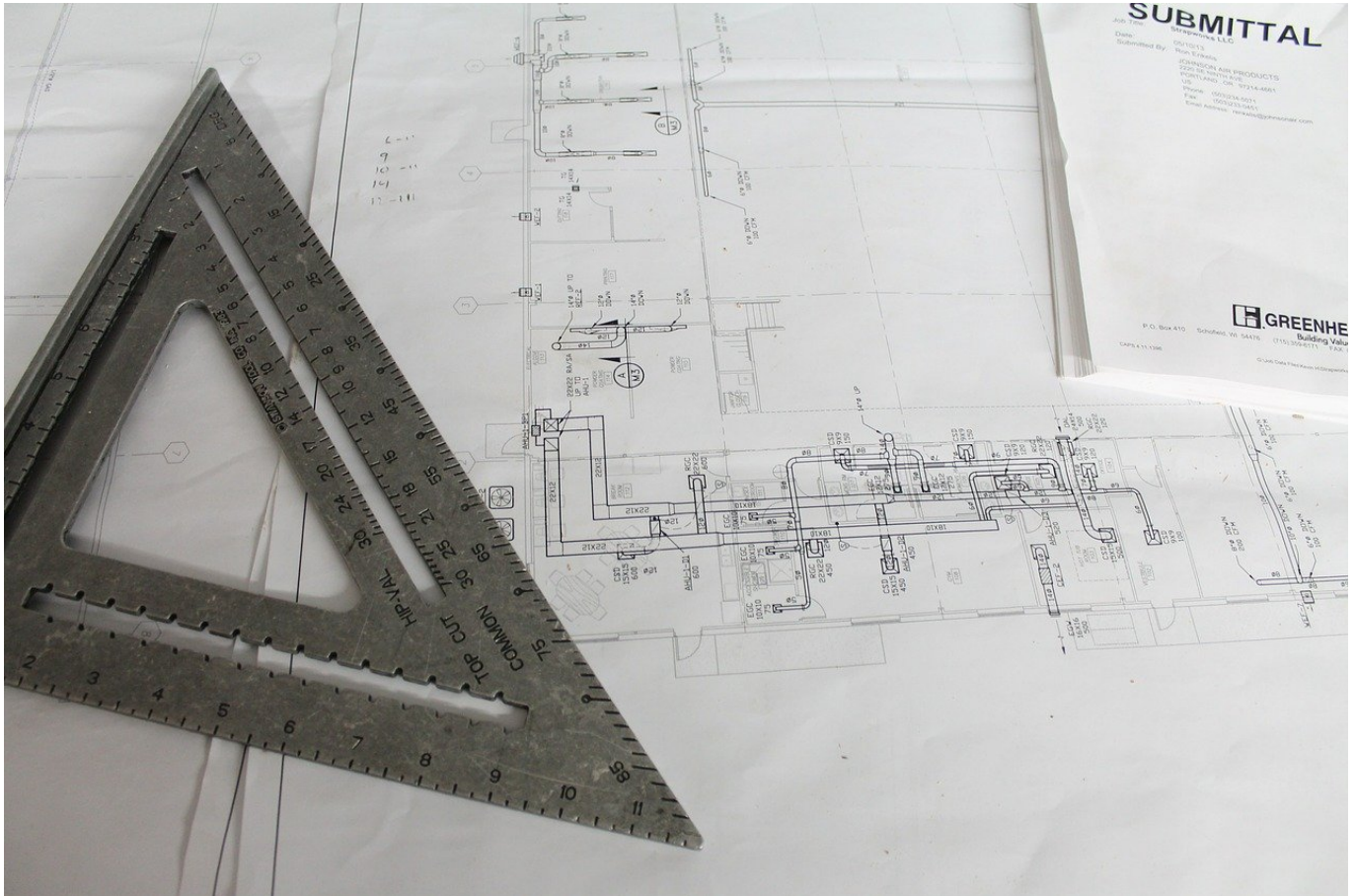


Blueprint as a Verb

Definitions of "Blueprint" as a verb

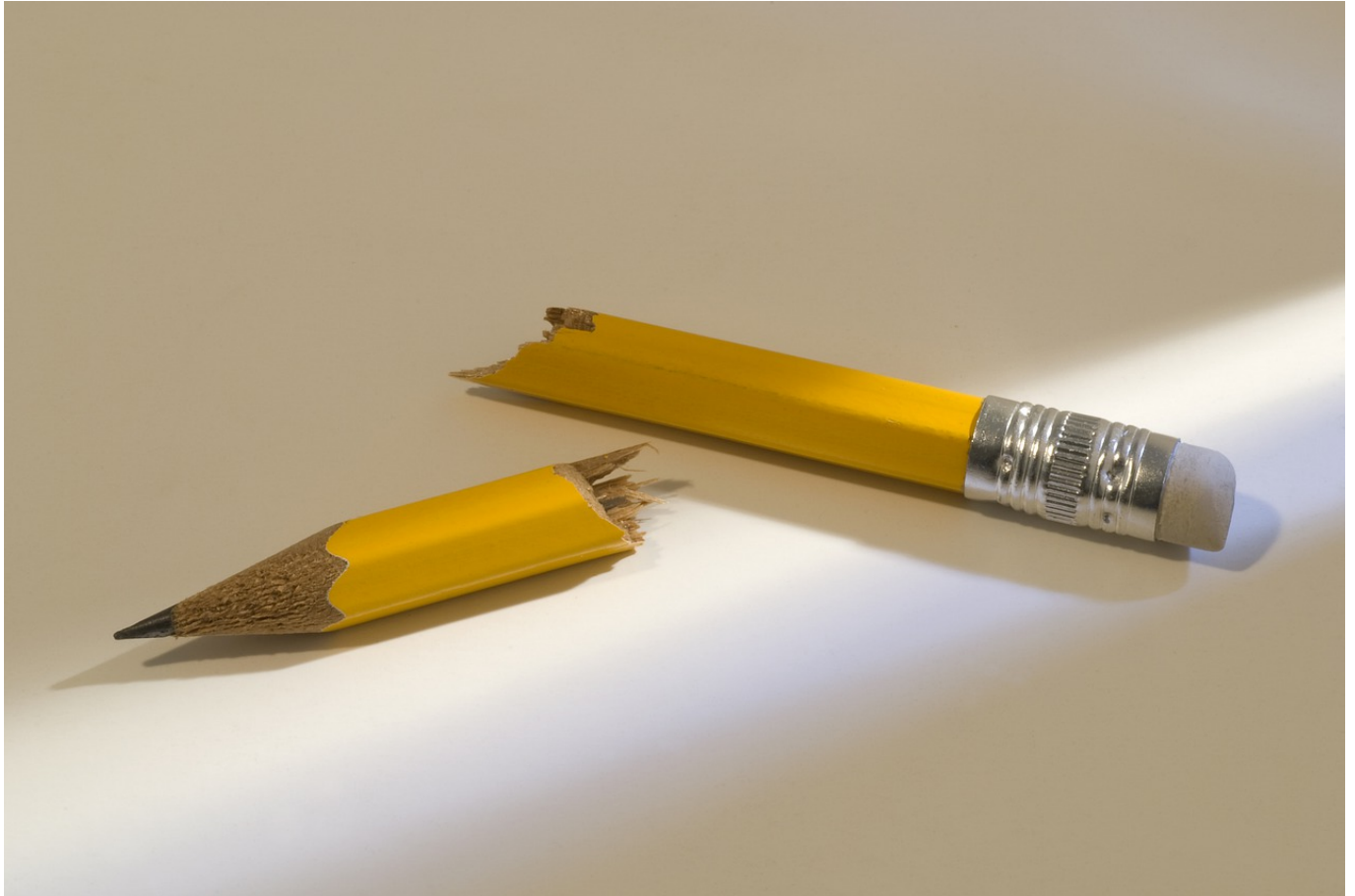
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "blueprint" as a verb can have the following definitions:

| draftsmanship | The creation of artistic pictures or diagrams. |
| drawing | The act of moving a load by drawing or pulling. <i>She took lessons in drawing.</i> |
| exploded | Showing the parts of something separated but in positions that show their correct relation to one another. <i>An exploded diagram of the rifle s parts.</i> |
| flowchart | A diagram of the sequence of operations in a computer program or an accounting system. |
| graffiti | Write words or drawings as graffiti. <i>He graffitied his tag on a window and door.</i> |
| graph | Plot upon a graph. |
| graphic | Of or relating to the graphic arts British Book News. <i>A graphic account of the riots.</i> |
| machination | A plot or scheme. |
| maneuver | Perform a movement in military or naval tactics in order to secure an advantage in attack or defense. <i>He made a great maneuver.</i> |
| painting | The occupation of a house painter. <i>Pastels require a different approach to painting.</i> |
| picture | Represent in a photograph or picture. <i>Poor picture quality.</i> |
| plat | Make a plat of. <i>They looked out over the plats of dark ground.</i> |

- plot** Mark out or allocate (points) on a graph.
*They concocted a **plot** to discredit the governor.*
- project** Make a projection of the earth sky etc on a plane surface.
*I noticed a slip of paper **projecting** from the book.*
- redesign** The action or process of redesigning something.
*The front seats have been **redesigned**.*
- representation** The act of representing; standing in for someone or some group and speaking with authority in their behalf.
*The **representation** of women in newspapers.*
- ruse** A deceptive maneuver (especially to avoid capture).
*Emma tried to think of a **ruse** to get Paul out of the house.*
- schematic** In technical contexts a schematic diagram in particular of an electric or electronic circuit.
*Freeman constructs a highly **schematic** reading of the play.*
- strategically** In a way that relates to the gaining of a military advantage.
***Strategically** important ports.*
