
Blur as a Noun

- Something remembered or perceived indistinctly, typically because it happened very fast.
- A thing that cannot be seen or heard clearly.

A very fine cloud of something such as vapour or smoke in the air. **haze**

A thin fog with condensation near the ground. **mist**


A **mist** rose out of the river.

- It happened so fast it was just a blur.






Blur as a Verb

Definitions of "Blur" as a verb

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "blur" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- To make less distinct or clear.
- Make a smudge on; soil by smudging.
- Become glassy; lose clear vision.
- Become vague or indistinct.
- Make or become unclear or less distinct.
- Make unclear, indistinct, or blurred.
- Make dim or indistinct.

Associations of "Blur" (30 Words)

Open to two or more interpretations; or of uncertain nature or ambiguous

significance; or (often) intended to mislead.

Uncertain or unable to decide about what course to follow. ambivalent

foggyIndistinctly expressed or remembered; obscure.

A dark and **foggy** night.

hazy Indistinct or hazy in outline.

School leavers were often **hazy** about employment.

illegibility The quality of writing (print or handwriting) that cannot be deciphered.

Lack of exactness or accuracy.

imprecision

All scientific measurements come with some degree of imprecision.

Not clearly visible or attracting attention.

inconspicuous

He pushed the string through an inconspicuous hole.

indefinite Not clearly expressed or defined; vague.

Were **indefinite** about their plans.

indistinct Not clearly defined or easy to perceive or understand.

Only **indistinct** notions of what to do.

lightproof

Not penetrable by light.

A **lightproof** envelope.

loom Weave on a loom.

Large shadows **loom**ed on the canyon wall.

misty Filled or abounding with fog or mist.

The **misty** evening.

nebulous Lacking definite form or limits- H.T.Moore.

Nebulous distinction between pride and conceit.

Make obscure or unclear.

An impulse to go off and fight certain **obscure** battles of his own spirit.

An opaque thing.

Technical jargon that was **opaque** to her.

slur Mark notes with a slur.

I can play it if I don t **slur** the notes.

smudge Make a smudge on soil by smudging.

Mascaras that **smudge** or flake around the eyes.

A subtle difference in meaning or opinion or attitude.

The textural **subtlety** of Degas.

Not obvious or definite; ambiguous.

Users are still **unclear** about what middleware does.



Not different or differentiated.

undifferentiated By six weeks the sexual glands are as yet undifferentiated between

male and female.

unnoticeable Not obtrusive or undesirably noticeable.

Her clothes were simple and unnoticeable.

Lacking clarity or distinctness.

Their descriptions of human behavior become **vague** dull and unclear.

Thin and weak.
