## Blurry as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Blurry" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “blurry” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Unable to perceive clear or sharp images.*
- *Not clearly or distinctly visible or audible.*
- *Perceived or remembered indistinctly.*
- *Indistinct or hazy in outline.*



### Synonyms of "Blurry" as an adjective (6 Words)

- bleary** Tired to the point of exhaustion.  
***Bleary** eyed business travellers.*
- blurred** Indistinct or hazy in outline.  
*The camera caught only two **blurred** images.*
- foggy** Obscured by fog.  
*A dark and **foggy** night.*
- fuzzy** Covering with fine light hairs.  
*The picture is very **fuzzy**.*
- hazy** Indistinct or hazy in outline.  
*The picture we have of him is extremely **hazy**.*
- muzzy** Blurred; indistinct.  
*A slightly **muzzy** picture.*



## Usage Examples of "Blurry" as an adjective

- *Video projectors provided extremely blurry images.*
- *There's a very blurry line between art and advertising.*
- *My memories of him are blurry at best.*
- *Vision may be hazy or blurry for a few days after surgery.*
- *Their eyes were blurry with tears.*
- *The trees were just blurry shapes.*



## Associations of "Blurry" (30 Words)

<b>ambiguous</b>	Having more than one possible meaning. <i>An <b>ambiguous</b> situation with no frame of reference.</i>
<u><a href="#">ambivalent</a></u>	Having mixed feelings or contradictory ideas about something or someone. <i>Was <b>ambivalent</b> about having children.</i>
<u><a href="#">blur</a></u>	Make unclear indistinct or blurred. <i>His novels <b>blur</b> the boundaries between criticism and fiction.</i>
<b>blurred</b>	Not clear or distinct; hazy. <i>The <b>blurred</b> distinctions between childhood and adulthood.</i>
<u><a href="#">cloud</a></u>	Make overcast or cloudy. <i>Blood pumped out <b>clouding</b> the water.</i>
<u><a href="#">cloudy</a></u>	Uncertain; unclear. <i>A very grey <b>cloudy</b> day.</i>

<b><u>dim</u></b>	Made dim or less bright. <i>You re just incredibly <b>dim</b>.</i>
<b> dusky</b>	Used in names of animals with dark coloration e g dusky dolphin dusky warbler. <i>A <b>dusky</b> complexion.</i>
<b><u>faint</u></b>	Deficient in magnitude; barely perceptible; lacking clarity or brightness or loudness etc. <i>She sent him a <b>faint</b> answering smile.</i>
<b><u>foggy</u></b>	Unable to think clearly; confused. <i>My memories of the event are <b>foggy</b>.</i>
<b><u>hazy</u></b>	Indistinct or hazy in outline. <i>The picture we have of him is extremely <b>hazy</b>.</i>
<b><u>humid</u></b>	Containing or characterized by a great deal of water vapor. <i><b>Humid</b> air.</i>
<b>imprecision</b>	The quality of lacking precision. <i>All scientific measurements come with some degree of <b>imprecision</b>.</i>
<b><u>inconspicuous</u></b>	Not prominent or readily noticeable. <i>He pushed the string through an <b>inconspicuous</b> hole.</i>
<b>indistinct</b>	Not clearly defined or easy to perceive or understand. <i><b>Indistinct</b> shapes in the gloom.</i>
<b>lightproof</b>	Not penetrable by light. <i>A <b>lightproof</b> envelope.</i>
<b>misty</b>	(of a colour) not bright; soft. <i>The <b>misty</b> air above the frozen river.</i>
<b>murkiness</b>	An atmosphere in which visibility is reduced because of a cloud of some substance.
<b><u>murky</u></b>	(of liquids) clouded as with sediment. <i><b>Murky</b> waters.</i>
<b>nebulous</b>	Lacking definite form or limits- H.T.Moore. <i><b>Nebulous</b> distinction between pride and conceit.</i>
<b><u>obscure</u></b>	Make obscure or unclear. <i>The big elm tree <b>obscures</b> our view of the valley.</i>
<b><u>opaque</u></b>	An opaque thing. <i><b>Opaque</b> to X rays.</i>
<b>shadowy</b>	Filled with shade. <i>A <b>shadowy</b> figure appeared through the mist.</i>



<b>turbid</b>	(of a liquid) cloudy, opaque, or thick with suspended matter. <i>The <b>turbid</b> estuary.</i>
<b><u>unclear</u></b>	Poorly stated or described. <i>The motive for this killing is <b>unclear</b>.</i>
<b>undifferentiated</b>	Not different or differentiated. <i>By six weeks the sexual glands are as yet <b>undifferentiated</b> between male and female.</i>
<b>unintelligible</b>	Poorly articulated or enunciated, or drowned by noise. <i>Dolphin sounds are <b>unintelligible</b> to humans.</i>
<b><u>vague</u></b>	Not precisely limited, determined, or distinguished. <i>He had been very <b>vague</b> about his activities.</i>
<b>vaguely</b>	In a way that is uncertain, indefinite or unclear; roughly. <i>He <b>vaguely</b> remembered talking to her once.</i>
<b>wispy</b>	Thin and weak- Edmund Wilson. <i>A <b>wispy</b> little fellow with small hands and feet.</i>
