abashed	Feeling or caused to feel uneasy and self-conscious. <i>Harriet looked slightly abashed.</i>
annoyed	Aroused to impatience or anger. <i>I got very annoyed watching the film.</i>
ashamed	Feeling shame or guilt or embarrassment or remorse. <i>I m ashamed to say I followed him home.</i>
awkward	Socially uncomfortable; unsure and constrained in manner. <i>An awkward dancer.</i>
bemused	Perplexed by many conflicting situations or statements; filled with bewilderment. <i>Lucy looked a little bemused.</i>
bewildered	Perplexed by many conflicting situations or statements; filled with bewilderment. <i>He saw the bewildered look on my face.</i>
confession	The religious body or Church sharing a confession of faith. <i>Confessions of a driving instructor.</i>
confuse	Identify wrongly; mistake. <i>The points made by the authors confuse rather than clarify the issue.</i>
criminal	Someone who has committed a crime or has been legally convicted of a crime. <i>He may never fulfil his potential and that would be a criminal waste.</i>
delinquent	A delinquent person. <i>Delinquent accounts.</i>
discomfit	Make (someone) feel uneasy or embarrassed. <i>He was not noticeably discomfited by her tone.</i>
disconcert	Cause to feel embarrassment. <i>The abrupt change of subject disconcerted her.</i>

disgraced	Suffering shame. <i>The disgraced city financier.</i>
<u>embarrassed</u>	Feeling or caused to feel uneasy and self-conscious. <i>He had to sort out the embarrassed financial affairs of his brother.</i>
embarrassing	Hard to deal with; especially causing pain or embarrassment. <i>Awkward or embarrassing or difficult moments in the discussion.</i>
embarrassment	A person or thing causing feelings of embarrassment. <i>His temporary financial embarrassment.</i>
exculpate	Show or declare that (someone) is not guilty of wrongdoing. <i>The article exculpated the mayor.</i>
<u>flush</u>	Denoting a type of toilet that has a flushing device. <i>They re trying to flush him out of hiding.</i>
fluster	Be flustered behave in a confused manner. <i>The main thing is not to get all in a fluster.</i>
guilty	Responsible for or chargeable with a reprehensible act. <i>Williams pleaded guilty to three separate offences.</i>
hangdog	Frightened into submission or compliance. <i>The hangdog and shamefaced air of the retreating enemy.</i>
<u>humiliating</u>	Making someone feel ashamed and foolish by injuring their dignity and pride. <i>A humiliating defeat.</i>
perplex	Be a mystery or bewildering to. <i>She was perplexed by her husband s moodiness.</i>
<u>perplexed</u>	Completely baffled; very puzzled. <i>She gave him a perplexed look.</i>
<u>shame</u>	Make someone feel ashamed. <i>He felt a pang of shame at telling Alice a lie.</i>
shoplift	Steal goods from a shop while pretending to be a customer. <i>She was caught shoplifting a pair of shoes.</i>
<u>sin</u>	Commit a sin violate a law of God or a moral law. <i>He committed the unforgivable sin of refusing to give interviews.</i>
<u>stymie</u>	A situation in golf where an opponent's ball blocks the line between your ball and the hole. <i>The changes must not be allowed to stymie new medical treatments.</i>
thrill	Cause to be thrilled by some perceptual input. <i>The thrills of space travel.</i>

troubled

Characterized by or indicative of distress or affliction or danger or need.
*His **troubled** face.*
