Having self-possession upset; thrown into confusion- G.B.Shaw. disconcerted

Looked at each other dumbly quite **disconcerted**.

Struck with fear, dread, or consternation. **dismayed**

Suffering from extreme anxiety, sorrow, or pain. distressed

Distressed about her son s leaving home.

As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise. dumbfounded

Iav explained to a dumbfounded Nick.

Feeling or caused to feel ill at ease or self-conscious or ashamed. embarrassed

humbled Low or inferior in station or quality.

Made to feel uncomfortable because of shame or wounded pride. humiliated

Humiliated that his wife had to go out to work.

Suffering from tissue death. mortified

So surprised and confused that one is unsure how to react. nonplussed

Henry looked completely **nonplussed**.

Feeling anxiety or concern; unsettled. perturbed

She didn t seem **perturbed** about the noises around her.

Bright **pink** lipstick.

Of a light shade of red. pinkish

Especially of the face reddened or suffused with or as if with blood from

red emotion or exertion.

red-faced Reddened or suffused with or as if with blood from emotion or exertion.

Having a red tinge; slightly red. reddish
