Definitions of "Boatload" as a noun

- *An amount of cargo or number of passengers which will fill a ship or boat.*
- *A large amount.*
- *The amount of cargo that can be held by a boat or ship or a freight car.*

Synonyms of "Boatload" as a noun (7 Words)

burden	The main responsibility for achieving a specified aim or task. <i>The schooner Wyoming of about 6 000 tons burden.</i>
cargo	Goods carried on a ship, aircraft, or motor vehicle. <i>Transportation of bulk cargo.</i>
carload	The amount of cargo that can be held by a boat or ship or a freight car. <i>A carload of passengers.</i>
charge	The price charged for some article or service. <i>The judge gave a painstakingly careful charge to the jury.</i>
freight	A charge for transport by freight. <i>A decline in the amount of freight carried by rail.</i>
freightage	The charge for transporting something by common carrier.

shipload The amount of cargo that can be held by a boat or ship or a freight car.
A **shipload** of food and medical aid was sent.

Usage Examples of "Boatload" as a noun

- *He imported wine by the boatload.*
- *The Telecommunications Reform Act created a boatload of new regulations.*
- *A boatload of coal.*
