freight A charge for transport by freight.

A decline in the amount of **freight** carried by rail.

**freightage** The charge for transporting something by common carrier.



shipload

The amount of cargo that can be held by a boat or ship or a freight car. A shipload of food and medical aid was sent.

- The Telecommunications Reform Act created a boatload of new regulations.
- A boatload of coal.
