after	At a later or future time afterwards. <i>Two hours after that.</i>
axle	A rod or spindle (either fixed or rotating) passing through the centre of a wheel or group of wheels. <i>Axle grease.</i>
back	Support financial backing for. <i>The back of a postcard.</i>
backwards	(of a movement) in the direction of one’s back. <i>Count backwards from twenty to ten.</i>
barber	Perform the services of a barber cut the hair and or beard of. <i>He had his hair cut at the local barber s.</i>
barbershop	A shop where men can get their hair cut. <i>A barbershop quartet.</i>
behind	A kick that sends the ball over a behind line or a touch that sends it between the inner posts scoring one point. <i>She slid inelegantly down a few steps on her behind.</i>
cat	A short tapered stick used in the game of tipcat. <i>I kept her off the wind and sailing free until I had the anchor catted.</i>
clock	Attain or register (a specified time, distance, or speed). <i>I thought I recognized your clock.</i>
counterweight	Constitute a counterweight or counterbalance to. <i>The scales have a series of counterweights that slide along a calibrated beam.</i>
fin	Equip a car with fins. <i>The sharks were finning near the surface.</i>
hackles	A feeling of anger and animosity. <i>Having one s hackles or dander up.</i>

haircut	The act of cutting the hair. <i>The banks would probably be willing to take a haircut on the rest.</i>
joggle	Fasten or join with a joggle. <i>The lurch and joggle of the car.</i>
lag	Cover with lagging to prevent heat loss. <i>Lag pipes.</i>
latency	The delay before a transfer of data begins following an instruction for its transfer. <i>The latency of tumours in mice.</i>
later	Coming at a subsequent time or stage. <i>I ll see you later.</i>
lion	The lion as an emblem e g of English or Scottish royalty or as a charge in heraldry.
mane	Long coarse hair growing from the crest of the animal's neck. <i>The horse was rushing about in the field tossing its mane.</i>
pendulum	Used to refer to the tendency of a situation to oscillate between one extreme and another. <i>The pendulum of fashion.</i>
posterior	Coming at a subsequent time or stage. <i>The mood posterior to.</i>
rear	Located in or toward the back or rear. <i>Cars with safety belts fitted in the rear.</i>
ringtail	An immature golden eagle.
shave	Touch the surface of lightly. <i>The barber shaves customers with a traditional cut throat razor.</i>
shorten	Make shorter than originally intended; reduce or retrench in length or duration. <i>Before sail could be shortened she went on to her beam ends.</i>
tail	Remove or shorten the tail of an animal. <i>He stormed off the tails of his jacket flapping behind him.</i>
tom	A black man considered to be excessively obedient or servile to white people. <i>It was insulting to hold out my hand and have a clerk bang the money down I d tommed again.</i>
tonsure	Shave the hair on top of a monk s or priest s head give a tonsure to. <i>He received the tonsure.</i>

A system of units used to express the weight of something.

wiggle

A wiggling movement.
*Vi **wiggled** her toes.*
