## Associations of "Bobbing" (30 Words)

<b>after</b>	At a later or future time afterwards. <i>Two hours <b>after</b> that.</i>
<b>axle</b>	A rod or spindle (either fixed or rotating) passing through the centre of a wheel or group of wheels. <i><b>Axle</b> grease.</i>
<a href="#">back</a>	Support financial backing for. <i>The <b>back</b> of a postcard.</i>
<b>backwards</b>	(of a movement) in the direction of one’s back. <i>Count <b>backwards</b> from twenty to ten.</i>
<a href="#">barber</a>	Perform the services of a barber cut the hair and or beard of. <i>He had his hair cut at the local <b>barber</b> s.</i>
<b>barbershop</b>	A shop where men can get their hair cut. <i>A <b>barbershop</b> quartet.</i>
<b>behind</b>	A kick that sends the ball over a behind line or a touch that sends it between the inner posts scoring one point. <i>She slid inelegantly down a few steps on her <b>behind</b>.</i>
<b>cat</b>	A short tapered stick used in the game of tipcat. <i>I kept her off the wind and sailing free until I had the anchor <b>catted</b>.</i>
<a href="#">clock</a>	Attain or register (a specified time, distance, or speed). <i>I thought I recognized your <b>clock</b>.</i>
<b>counterweight</b>	Constitute a counterweight or counterbalance to. <i>The scales have a series of <b>counterweights</b> that slide along a calibrated beam.</i>
<b>fin</b>	Equip a car with fins. <i>The sharks were <b>finning</b> near the surface.</i>
<b>hackles</b>	A feeling of anger and animosity. <i>Having one s <b>hackles</b> or dander up.</i>

<b>haircut</b>	The act of cutting the hair. <i>The banks would probably be willing to take a <b>haircut</b> on the rest.</i>
<b>joggle</b>	Fasten or join with a joggle. <i>The lurch and <b>joggle</b> of the car.</i>
<b>lag</b>	Cover with lagging to prevent heat loss. <i><b>Lag</b> pipes.</i>
<b>latency</b>	The delay before a transfer of data begins following an instruction for its transfer. <i>The <b>latency</b> of tumours in mice.</i>
<b>later</b>	Coming at a subsequent time or stage. <i>I ll see you <b>later</b>.</i>
<b>lion</b>	The lion as an emblem e g of English or Scottish royalty or as a charge in heraldry.
<b>mane</b>	Long coarse hair growing from the crest of the animal's neck. <i>The horse was rushing about in the field tossing its <b>mane</b>.</i>
<b>pendulum</b>	Used to refer to the tendency of a situation to oscillate between one extreme and another. <i>The <b>pendulum</b> of fashion.</i>
<b>posterior</b>	Coming at a subsequent time or stage. <i>The mood <b>posterior</b> to.</i>
<b>rear</b>	Located in or toward the back or rear. <i>Cars with safety belts fitted in the <b>rear</b>.</i>
<b>ringtail</b>	An immature golden eagle.
<b>shave</b>	Touch the surface of lightly. <i>The barber <b>shaves</b> customers with a traditional cut throat razor.</i>
<b>shorten</b>	Make shorter than originally intended; reduce or retrench in length or duration. <i>Before sail could be <b>shortened</b> she went on to her beam ends.</i>
<b>tail</b>	Remove or shorten the tail of an animal. <i>He stormed off the <b>tails</b> of his jacket flapping behind him.</i>
<b>tom</b>	A black man considered to be excessively obedient or servile to white people. <i>It was insulting to hold out my hand and have a clerk bang the money down I d <b>tommed</b> again.</i>
<b>tonsure</b>	Shave the hair on top of a monk s or priest s head give a tonsure to. <i>He received the <b>tonsure</b>.</i>
