barefaced	Having an uncovered face. <i>A barefaced hypocrite.</i>
brassy	Resembling brass in colour. <i>Her brassy audacious exterior.</i>
<u>brazen</u>	Made of or resembling brass (as in color or hardness). <i>Brazen arrogance.</i>
brazen-faced	Unrestrained by convention or propriety- Los Angeles Times.
cute	Clever or cunning, especially in a self-seeking or superficial way. <i>A child with intolerably cute mannerisms.</i>
<u>delightful</u>	Causing delight; charming. <i>A delightful surprise.</i>
<u>endearing</u>	Lovable especially in a childlike or naive way. <i>An endearing little grin.</i>
good-looking	Pleasing in appearance especially by reason of conformity to ideals of form and proportion- Thackeray.
<u>insolent</u>	Unrestrained by convention or propriety. <i>The modern world with its quick material successes and insolent belief in the boundless possibilities of progress.</i>
likeable	Easy to like; agreeable. <i>A very likeable young woman.</i>
lovable	Inspiring or deserving love or affection. <i>A mischievous but lovable child.</i>
lovely	Lovable especially in a childlike or naive way. <i>Lovely views.</i>
<u>pleasant</u>	Affording pleasure; being in harmony with your taste or likings. <i>We had a pleasant evening together.</i>
pleasing	Satisfying or appealing. <i>A pleasing piece of news.</i>
prepossessing	Attractive or appealing in appearance. <i>Strong and vigorous and of prepossessing appearance.</i>
<u>sweet</u>	With sweetening added. <i>Sweet revenge.</i>
